BID OPENING DATE

1. The Bid Opening Date of October 18, 2013 at 2:15:00 p.m. **remains the same.**

2. **Add the following Section:**

C. Guidelines for Protecting Desert Tortoises During Restoration Activities

Prior to the start of work, all contractor staff shall attend a brief desert tortoise avoidance training provided by the Desert Conservation Program. Training will provide information on avoidance measures during project activities.

No more than forty eight hours prior to the start of work, project areas shall be inspected by qualified individuals (someone with desert tortoise experience) for potential desert tortoise burrows. All potential tortoise burrows shall be investigated (with a tortoise scope) to determine if a desert tortoise is present (active). If the burrow is determined to be active, flagging shall be placed at the burrow site. A buffer zone of 15 feet shall be maintained surrounding the burrow and the area shall be avoided by heavy equipment. This buffer area shall be excluded from restoration activities. If the burrow is not active, it should be collapsed to prevent a tortoise from accessing it prior to ground disturbance.

If a live tortoise is observed aboveground, and it is not in the path of restoration activities or otherwise in harm's way, it should be left alone, but monitored to ensure it is not adversely affected by construction. If the tortoise is within the path of restoration activities, or otherwise in harm's way, it should be managed in accordance with procedures provided in the training. All motorized vehicles shall stay on existing road and operators must look for tortoises prior to movement of vehicles.

Except as modified herein, all other bid specifications, terms, conditions, and special provisions shall remain the same.
