ADDENDUM NO. 1

INVITATION TO BID

1. The Bid Opening date of May 21, 2015 at 3:00:00 p.m. **has been changed to May 22, 2015 at 3:00:00 p.m.**

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

2. **Delete** the reference to "Contractor" throughout the section (pages IV-1 through IV-12) and **replace** with "SUCCESSFUL BIDDER".
3. Section 2, Test Sample, (pages IV-2 through IV-3):

Replace Section 2, Test Sample, in its entirety with the following:

- A. One (1) gallon of paint sample for each type and color shall be submitted by the SUCCESSFUL BIDDER within 21 calendar days of Notice of Award. These initial samples will be retained by Clark County Public Works (CCPW) during the life of the contract including any contract renewals, and be considered as the "Base Line" of acceptance.
 - B. The paint sample shall be packaged in unit containers with labels with the following information:
 - a. Name and type of paint
 - b. Color of paint
 - c. Batch Number
 - d. Date of Manufacture
 - e. Quantity of Paint in Container
 - f. Information and Warnings as may be required by Federal and State Laws
 - g. Manufacturer's Name and Address
 - C. Paint samples may be tested by CCPW. SUCCESSFUL BIDDER shall be responsible to ensure that the paint supplied meet the required specifications, regardless of CCPW's testing.
 - D. Test samples for each shipment of materials will not be required. However, in the event that CCPW suspects the paint supplied does not meet the specifications, SUCCESSFUL BIDDER shall, at no additional costs, provide and deliver test samples upon request.
4. Section 5, General – Waterborne Paint (pages IV-4 through IV-5):

Replace Paragraph A with the following:

Rapid Dry 100% Acrylic Waterborne Cross-link Polymer Paint shall meet the requirements specified in Federal Specification TT-P-1952, Type III, latest revision, unless otherwise specified in these Technical Specifications.

5. Section 10, One-Time Removal of Existing 55-Gallon Drums (page IV-12):

Add the following:

The existing 55-gallon drums are un-lined, and have no more than 1 inch of paint residue. All estimated 170 existing drums are for solvent based paint.

Removal and/or disposal of the empty drums shall be performed in accordance with applicable state and federal hazardous waste regulations. It's the responsibility of the SUCCESSFUL BIDDER to properly dispose or recycle the drums. SUCCESSFUL BIDDER shall provide documentations (i.e., receipt) to CCPW that the drums were dropped off at a facility certified to do recycling and/or disposal of hazardous waste.

The bid item One-Time Removal of Existing Drums is for the existing stockpiled empty drums only. Pick up and removal of empty drums supplied with this contract including any contract renewals shall be considered as incidental and included as part of the price bid for the paint materials.
