GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. TERMS

The term "COUNTY," as used throughout this document will mean the County of Clark, Nevada. The term "BCC" as used throughout this document will mean the Board of County Commissioners which is the Governing Body of Clark County. The term "CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER" as used throughout this document will mean the Clark County Chief Financial Officer or her designee responsible for the Purchasing and Contracts Division. The term "PROPOSER" as used throughout this document will mean the respondents to this Request for Qualifications. The term "RFQ" as used throughout this document will mean Request for Qualifications.

2. INTENT

COUNTY is soliciting proposals for Bridge Housing Program Services on behalf of the Department of Social Service.

3. SCOPE OF PROJECT

The purpose of the Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") is to solicit a pool of qualified vendors, through a competitive selection process, who can provide room and board housing to individuals and families who require temporary housing placement until permanent housing options are identified. The COUNTY is seeking qualified vendors that demonstrate experience in the short term housing/apartment/SRO (Single Room Occupancy) rental market with an emphasis on vendors that can provide furnished housing.

Fully furnished units preferably with a kitchenette or other cooking facility, and a refrigerator (mandatory) of a size appropriate for the housing unit to store food and medication for qualified Guests (tenants) are needed.

Although standalone sites are preferred, the COUNTY will also consider units in multiple buildings. Sites that are available in a short time are preferred. The COUNTY will not consider low-density housing including but not limited to rooms located within a private residence.

5. CONTACT WITH COUNTY DURING RFQ PROCESS

Communication between a PROPOSER and a member of the BCC or between a PROPOSER and a non-designated COUNTY contact regarding the selection of a proponent or award of this Contract is prohibited from the time the RFQ is advertised until the item is posted on an agenda for award of the Contract. Questions pertaining to this RFQ shall be addressed to the designated contact(s) specified in the RFQ document. Failure of a PROPOSER, or any of its representatives, to comply with this paragraph may result in their proposal being rejected.

7. METHOD OF EVALUATION AND AWARD

This RFQ will be awarded in accordance with the provisions of the Nevada Revised Statutes, Chapter 332, Purchasing: Local Governments.

The proposals may be reviewed individually by staff members through an ad hoc committee to assist the PURCHASING MANAGER OR HER DESIGNEE. The finalists may be requested to provide COUNTY a presentation and/or an oral interview. The ad hoc staff committee may review the RFQ's as well as any requested presentations and/or oral interviews to gather information that will assist in making the recommendation. COUNTY reserves the right to award the Contract based on objective and/or subjective evaluation criteria. This Contract will be awarded on the basis of which proposal COUNTY deems best suited to fulfill the requirements of the RFQ. COUNTY also reserves the right not to make an award if it is deemed that no single proposal fully meets the requirement of this RFQ.

The fees for the housing will be negotiated with the PROPOSER(S) selected.

8. SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

The proposal submitted should not exceed 25 pages. Other attachments may be included with no guarantee of review.

All proposals shall be on 8-1/2" x 11" paper bound with tabbed dividers labeled by section to correspond with the evaluation information requested. The ideal proposal will be 3-hole punched and bound with a binder clip. Binders or spiral binding is not preferred or required.

The PROPOSER shall submit one (1) clearly labeled original and six (6) copies of their proposal, including one (1) CD or flash drive with an electronic copy of their proposal, preferably in .pdf format. A single .pdf document of the entire proposal is preferred. The name of the PROPOSER'S firm shall be indicated on the spine and cover of each binder (if used) and CD label.

All proposals must be submitted in a sealed envelope plainly marked with the name and address of the PROPOSER and the RFQ number and title. No responsibility will attach to COUNTY or any official or employee thereof, for the pre-opening of, post-opening of, or the failure to open a proposal not properly addressed and identified. Proposals are time-stamped upon receipt. Proposals time-stamped after 3:00:00 p.m. based on the time clock at the Clark County Purchasing and Contracts front desk will be recorded as late, remain unopened and be formally rejected. FAXED OR ELECTRONIC SUBMITTALS ARE NOT ALLOWED AND WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

Regardless of the method used for delivery, PROPOSER(S) shall be wholly responsible for the timely delivery of submitted proposals.

9. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL

PROPOSER(S) may request withdrawal of a posted, sealed proposal prior to the scheduled proposal opening time provided the request for withdrawal is submitted to the Purchasing Analyst in writing or a proposal release form has been properly filled out and submitted to the Purchasing and Contracts Division reception desk. Proposals must be re-submitted and time-stamped in accordance with the RFQ document in order to be accepted.

No proposal may be withdrawn for a period of 90 calendar days after the date of proposal opening. All proposals received are considered firm offers during this period. The PROPOSER'S offer will expire after 90 calendar days.

If a PROPOSER intended for award withdraws their proposal, that PROPOSER may be deemed non-responsible if responding to future solicitations.

10. REJECTION OF PROPOSAL

COUNTY reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received by reason of this request.

11. PROPOSAL COSTS

There shall be no obligation for COUNTY to compensate PROPOSER(S) for any costs of responding to this RFQ.

12. ALTERNATE PROPOSALS

Alternate proposals are defined as those that do not meet the requirements of this RFQ. Alternate proposals will not be considered.

13. ADDENDA AND INTERPRETATIONS

If it becomes necessary to revise any part of the RFQ, a written addendum will be provided to all PROPOSERS in written form from the Purchasing Analyst. COUNTY is not bound by any specifications by COUNTY'S employees, unless such clarification or change is provided to PROPOSERS in written addendum form from the Purchasing Analyst.

14. PUBLIC RECORDS

COUNTY is a Public Agency as defined by State Law, and as such, is subject to the Nevada Public Records Law (Chapter 239 of the Nevada Revised Statutes). Under the law, all of COUNTY'S records are public records (unless otherwise declared by law to be confidential) and are subject to inspection and copying by any person. However, in accordance with NRS 332.061(2), a proposal that requires negotiation or evaluation by COUNTY may not be disclosed until the proposal is recommended for award of a Contract.

15. PROPOSALS ARE NOT TO CONTAIN CONFIDENTIAL / PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

Proposals must contain sufficient information to be evaluated and a contract written without reference to any confidential or proprietary information. PROPOSER(S) shall not include any information in their proposal that they would not want to be released to the public. Any proposal submitted that is marked "Confidential" or "Proprietary," or that contains materials so marked, will be returned to the PROPOSER and will not be considered for award.

16. COLLUSION AND ADVANCE DISCLOSURES

Pursuant to 332.165 evidence of agreement or collusion among PROPOSER(S) and prospective PROPOSER(S) acting to illegally restrain freedom of competition by agreement to bid a fixed price, or otherwise, shall render the offers of such PROPOSER(S) void.

Advance disclosures of any information to any particular PROPOSER(S) which gives that particular PROPOSER any advantage over any other interested PROPOSER(S), in advance of the opening of proposals, whether in response to advertising or an informal request for proposals, made or permitted by a member of the governing body or an employee or representative thereof, shall operate to void all proposals received in response to that particular request for proposals.

17. CONTRACT

A sample of COUNTY'S Standard Contract is attached. Any proposed modifications to the terms and conditions of the Standard Contract are subject to review and approval by the Clark County District Attorney's Office.

18. BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

CLARK COUNTY BUSINESS LICENSE / REGISTRATION

Prior to award of this RFQ, other than for the supply of goods being shipped directly to a Clark County facility, the successful PROPOSER will be required to obtain a Clark County business license or register annually as a limited vendor business with the Clark County Business License Department.

A. Clark County Business License is Required if:

- i. A business is physically located in unincorporated Clark County, Nevada.
- ii. The work to be performed is located in unincorporated Clark County, Nevada.

B. Register as a Limited Vendor Business Registration if:

- i. A business is physically located outside of unincorporated Clark County, Nevada.
- ii. A business is physically located outside the state of Nevada.

The Clark County Department of Business License can answer any questions concerning determination of which requirement is applicable to your firm. - ii. Provide a brief description of your organization locally, statewide and nationally (if applicable). Include the year your firm was established.
- iii. Indicate if your firm has an office in Clark County and the year it was established, if any.
- iv. Indicate if your firm is a minority-owned business, women-owned business, physically challenged business, small business, or a Nevada business enterprise as defined in Exhibit C of the attached contract.

- vii. PROPOSER must provide a statement that firm will comply with insurance requirements in Exhibit D of Sample Contract (attached). (Insurance is required if services are to be provided on-site)
- viii. Provide COUNTY with the key elements and unique feature of your proposal by briefly describing how the PROPOSER will accomplish the project.
- ix. List any other factor known to PROPOSER that could materially impair the ability of PROPOSER to carry out its duties and obligations under this Contract or that could materially affect COUNTY'S decision.

B. Experience

- i. Include a brief resume of all similar projects your firm has performed for the past 3 years. Each project listed shall include the name and phone number of a contact person for the project for review purposes.
- ii. Describe and document the applicable licenses which are held by the PROPOSER and its proposed subcontractors.

C. Description of Proposed Project and Work Plan

Describe in more detail the PROPOSER's approach to the project. Include a preliminary project plan that includes:

- i. Provide a brief description of the facility, a floor plan(s), and pictures of the facility.

D. Project Fee

Use the attached MS Spreadsheet (Exhibit D) to submit your Project Fee.

E. Compliance with the COUNTY'S Standard Contract

Indicate any exceptions that your firm would have to take in order to accept the attached Standard Contract. PROPOSER(S) are advised that any exception that is determined to be material may be grounds for elimination in the selection process.

F. Other

Other factors the PROPOSER determines appropriate which would indicate to COUNTY that the PROPOSER has the necessary capability, competence, and performance record to accomplish the project in a timely and cost-effective manner.

CONTRACT FOR BRIDGE HOUSING PROGRAM SERVICES

This Contract is made and entered into this ____ day of _____ 2015, by and between CLARK COUNTY, NEVADA (hereinafter referred to as COUNTY), and _____ (hereinafter referred to as PROVIDER), for Bridge Housing Program Services (hereinafter referred to as PROJECT).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has the personnel and resources necessary to accomplish the PROJECT as specified in Exhibit A, Scope of Work and in accordance with the fixed cost budget specified the PROVIDER which shall be inclusive of any and all expenses; and

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has the required licenses and/or authorizations pursuant to all federal, State of Nevada and local laws in order to conduct business relative to this Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, COUNTY and PROVIDER agree as follows:

SECTION I: TERM OF CONTRACT

COUNTY agrees to retain PROVIDER for the period from date of award through June 30, 2017, with the option to renew for three (3), one-year periods subject to the provisions of Sections II and VIII herein. During this period, PROVIDER agrees to provide services as required by COUNTY within the scope of this Contract. COUNTY reserves the right to extend the Contract for up to an additional three (3) months for its convenience.

SECTION II: COMPENSATION AND TERMS OF PAYMENT

A. Compensation

COUNTY agrees to pay PROVIDER for the provision of housing described in the Scope of Work (Exhibit A) for the fees described in Exhibit D.

B. Progress Payments

PROVIDER will be entitled to monthly payments for housing provided in accordance with the Scope of Work (Exhibit A).

C. Terms of Payments

1. Each invoice received by COUNTY must include a detailed description of housing provided in accordance with Exhibit A, Scope of Work.
2. Payment of invoices will be made within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of an accurate invoice that has been reviewed and approved COUNTY.
3. COUNTY, at its discretion, may not approve or issue payment on invoices if PROVIDER fails to provide the following information required on each invoice:
 - a. The title of the PROJECT as stated in Exhibit A, Scope of Work, COUNTY'S Contract Number, Project Number, Purchase Order Number, Invoice Date, Invoice Period, Invoice Number, and the Payment Remittance Address.
 - b. Expenses not defined in Exhibit A, Scope of Work will not be paid without prior written authorization by COUNTY.
 - c. COUNTY'S representative shall notify PROVIDER in writing within fourteen (14) calendar days of any disputed amount included on the invoice. PROVIDER must submit a new invoice for the undisputed amount which will be paid in accordance with paragraph C.2 above. Upon mutual resolution of the disputed amount PROVIDER will submit a new invoice for the agreed to amount and payment will be made in accordance with paragraph C.2 above.
4. No penalty will be imposed on COUNTY if COUNTY fails to pay PROVIDER within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of a properly documented invoice, and COUNTY will receive no discount for payment within that period.
5. In the event that legal action is taken by COUNTY or PROVIDER based on a disputed payment, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs subject to COUNTY'S available unencumbered budgeted appropriations for the PROJECT.

6. COUNTY shall subtract from any payment made to PROVIDER all damages, costs and expenses caused by PROVIDER'S negligence, resulting from or arising out of errors or omissions in PROVIDER'S work products, which have not been previously paid to PROVIDER.
7. COUNTY shall not provide payment on any invoice PROVIDER submits after six (6) months from the date PROVIDER performs services, provides deliverables, and/or meets milestones, as agreed upon in Exhibit A, Scope of Work.
8. Invoices shall be submitted to: Department of Social Service, 1600 Pinto Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89108.

D. County's Fiscal Limitations

1. The content of this section shall apply to the entire Contract and shall take precedence over any conflicting terms and conditions, and shall limit COUNTY'S financial responsibility as indicated in Sections 2 and 3 below.
2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Contract, this Contract shall terminate and COUNTY'S obligations under it shall be extinguished at the end of the fiscal year in which COUNTY fails to appropriate monies for the ensuing fiscal year sufficient for the payment of all amounts which will then become due.
3. COUNTY'S total liability for all charges for services which may become due under this Contract is limited to the total maximum expenditure(s) authorized in COUNTY'S purchase order(s) to PROVIDER.

SECTION III: SCOPE OF WORK

Services to be performed by PROVIDER for the PROJECT shall consist of the work described in the Scope of Work as set forth in Exhibit A of this Contract, attached hereto.

SECTION IV: CHANGES TO SCOPE OF WORK

- A. COUNTY may at any time, by written order, make changes within the general scope of this Contract and in the services or work to be performed. If such changes cause an increase or decrease in PROVIDER'S cost or time required for performance of any services under this Contract, an equitable adjustment limited to an amount within current unencumbered budgeted appropriations for the PROJECT shall be made and this Contract shall be modified in writing accordingly. Any claim of PROVIDER for the adjustment under this clause must be submitted in writing within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of receipt by PROVIDER of notification of change unless COUNTY grants a further period of time before the date of final payment under this Contract.
- B. No services for which an additional compensation will be charged by PROVIDER shall be furnished without the written authorization of COUNTY.

SECTION V: RESPONSIBILITY OF PROVIDER

- A. It is understood that in the performance of the services herein provided for, PROVIDER shall be, and is, an independent contractor, and is not an agent, representative or employee of COUNTY and shall furnish such services in its own manner and method except as required by this Contract. Further, PROVIDER has and shall retain the right to exercise full control over the employment, direction, compensation and discharge of all persons employed by PROVIDER in the performance of the services hereunder. PROVIDER shall be solely responsible for, and shall indemnify, defend and hold COUNTY harmless from all matters relating to the payment of its employees, including compliance with social security, withholding and all other wages, salaries, benefits, taxes, demands, and regulations of any nature whatsoever.
- B. PROVIDER shall appoint a Manager, upon written acceptance by COUNTY, who will manage the performance of services. All of the services specified by this Contract shall be performed by the Manager, or by PROVIDER'S associates and employees under the personal supervision of the Manager. Should the Manager, or any employee of PROVIDER be unable to complete his or her responsibility for any reason, PROVIDER must obtain written approval by COUNTY prior to replacing him or her with another equally qualified person. If PROVIDER fails to make a required replacement within thirty (30) calendar days, COUNTY may terminate this Contract for default.
- C. PROVIDER has, or will, retain such employees as it may need to perform the services required by this Contract. Such employees shall not be employed by COUNTY.

- D. PROVIDER agrees that its officers and employees will cooperate with COUNTY in the performance of services under this Contract and will be available for consultation with COUNTY at such reasonable times with advance notice as to not conflict with their other responsibilities.
- E. PROVIDER will follow COUNTY'S standard procedures as followed by COUNTY'S staff in regard to programming changes; testing; change control; and other similar activities.
- F. PROVIDER shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion, and coordination of all services furnished by PROVIDER, its subcontractors and its and their principals, officers, employees and agents under this Contract. In performing the specified services, PROVIDER shall follow practices consistent with generally accepted professional and technical standards.
- G. It shall be the duty of PROVIDER to assure that all products of its effort are technically sound and in conformance with all pertinent Federal, State and Local statutes, codes, ordinances, resolutions and other regulations. PROVIDER will not produce a work product which violates or infringes on any copyright or patent rights. PROVIDER shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or omissions in its work products.
 - 1. Permitted or required approval by COUNTY of any products or services furnished by PROVIDER shall not in any way relieve PROVIDER of responsibility for the professional and technical accuracy and adequacy of its work.
 - 2. COUNTY's review, approval, acceptance, or payment for any of PROVIDER'S services herein shall not be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Contract or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Contract, and PROVIDER shall be and remain liable in accordance with the terms of this Contract and applicable law for all damages to COUNTY caused by PROVIDER'S performance or failures to perform under this Contract.
- H. All materials, information, and documents, whether finished, unfinished, drafted, developed, prepared, completed, or acquired by PROVIDER for COUNTY relating to the services to be performed hereunder and not otherwise used or useful in connection with services previously rendered, or services to be rendered, by PROVIDER to parties other than COUNTY shall become the property of COUNTY and shall be delivered to COUNTY'S representative upon completion or termination of this Contract, whichever comes first. PROVIDER shall not be liable for damages, claims, and losses arising out of any reuse of any work products on any other project conducted by COUNTY. COUNTY shall have the right to reproduce all documentation supplied pursuant to this Contract.
- I. The rights and remedies of COUNTY provided for under this section are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under other sections of this Contract.

SECTION VI: SUBCONTRACTS

- A. Services specified by this Contract shall not be subcontracted by PROVIDER, without prior written approval of COUNTY.
- B. Approval by COUNTY of PROVIDER'S request to subcontract, or acceptance of, or payment for, subcontracted work by COUNTY shall not in any way relieve PROVIDER of responsibility for the professional and technical accuracy and adequacy of the work. PROVIDER shall be and remain liable for all damages to COUNTY caused by negligent performance or non-performance of work under this Contract by PROVIDER'S subcontractor or its sub-subcontractor.
- C. The compensation due under Section II shall not be affected by COUNTY'S approval of PROVIDER'S request to subcontract.

SECTION VII: RESPONSIBILITY OF COUNTY

- A. COUNTY agrees that its officers and employees will cooperate with PROVIDER in the performance of services under this Contract and will be available for consultation with PROVIDER at such reasonable times with advance notice as to not conflict with their other responsibilities.
- B. The services performed by PROVIDER under this Contract shall be subject to review for compliance with the terms of this Contract by COUNTY'S representative, Brooke Page, Department of Social Service, telephone number (702) 455-3704 or their designee. COUNTY'S representative may delegate any or all of his responsibilities under this Contract to appropriate staff members, and shall so inform PROVIDER by written notice before the effective date of each such delegation.

- C. The review comments of COUNTY'S representative may be reported in writing as needed to PROVIDER. It is understood that COUNTY'S representative's review comments do not relieve PROVIDER from the responsibility for the professional and technical accuracy of all work delivered under this Contract.
- D. COUNTY shall assist PROVIDER in obtaining data on documents from public officers or agencies, and from private citizens and/or business firms, whenever such material is necessary for the completion of the services specified by this Contract.
- E. PROVIDER will not be responsible for accuracy of information or data supplied by COUNTY or other sources to the extent such information or data would be relied upon by a reasonably prudent PROVIDER.

SECTION VIII: TIME SCHEDULE

- A. Time is of the essence of this Contract.
- B. If PROVIDER'S performance of services is delayed or if PROVIDER'S sequence of tasks is changed, PROVIDER shall notify COUNTY'S representative in writing of the reasons for the delay and prepare a revised schedule for performance of services. The revised schedule is subject to COUNTY'S written approval.

SECTION IX: SUSPENSION AND TERMINATION

- A. Suspension

COUNTY may suspend performance by PROVIDER under this Contract for such period of time as COUNTY, at its sole discretion, may prescribe by providing written notice to PROVIDER at least 10 working days prior to the date on which COUNTY wishes to suspend. Upon such suspension, COUNTY shall pay PROVIDER its compensation, based on the percentage of the PROJECT completed and earned until the effective date of suspension, less all previous payments. PROVIDER shall not perform further work under this Contract after the effective date of suspension until receipt of written notice from COUNTY to resume performance. In the event COUNTY suspends performance by PROVIDER for any cause other than the error or omission of the PROVIDER, for an aggregate period in excess of thirty (30) days, PROVIDER shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment of the compensation payable to PROVIDER under this Contract to reimburse PROVIDER for additional costs occasioned as a result of such suspension of performance by COUNTY based on appropriated funds and approval by COUNTY.
- B. Termination
 - 1. This Contract may be terminated in whole or in part by either party in the event of substantial failure or default of the other party to fulfill its obligations under this Contract through no fault of the terminating party; but only after the other party is given:
 - a. not less than ten (10) calendar days written notice of intent to terminate; and
 - b. an opportunity for consultation with the terminating party prior to termination.
 - 2. Termination for Convenience
 - a. This Contract may be terminated in whole or in part by COUNTY for its convenience; but only after PROVIDER is given:
 - i. not less than ten (10) calendar days written notice of intent to terminate; and
 - ii. an opportunity for consultation with COUNTY prior to termination.
 - b. If termination is for COUNTY'S convenience, COUNTY shall pay PROVIDER that portion of the compensation which has been earned as of the effective date of termination but no amount shall be allowed for anticipated profit on performed or unperformed services or other work.
 - 3. Termination for Default
 - a. If termination for substantial failure or default is effected by COUNTY, COUNTY will pay PROVIDER that portion of the compensation which has been earned as of the effective date of termination but:
 - i. No amount shall be allowed for anticipated profit on performed or unperformed services or other work; and
 - ii. Any payment due to PROVIDER at the time of termination may be adjusted to the extent of any additional costs occasioned to COUNTY by reason of PROVIDER'S default.

C. Non-Discrimination/Public Funds

The BCC is committed to promoting full and equal business opportunity for all persons doing business in Clark County. PROVIDER acknowledges that COUNTY has an obligation to ensure that public funds are not used to subsidize private discrimination. PROVIDER recognizes that if they or their subcontractors are found guilty by an appropriate authority of refusing to hire or do business with an individual or company due to reasons of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression, age, disability, national origin, or any other protected status, COUNTY may declare PROVIDER in breach of the Contract, terminate the Contract, and designate PROVIDER as non-responsible.

D. Assignment

Any attempt by PROVIDER to assign or otherwise transfer any interest in this Contract without the prior written consent of COUNTY shall be void.

E. Indemnity

PROVIDER does hereby agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless COUNTY and the employees, officers and agents of COUNTY from any liabilities, damages, losses, claims, actions or proceedings, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, that are caused by the negligence, errors, omissions, recklessness or intentional misconduct of PROVIDER or the employees or agents of PROVIDER in the performance of this Contract.

F. Governing Law

Nevada law shall govern the interpretation of this Contract.

G. Gratuities

1. COUNTY may, by written notice to PROVIDER, terminate this Contract if it is found after notice and hearing by COUNTY that gratuities (in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise) were offered or given by PROVIDER or any agent or representative of PROVIDER to any officer or employee of COUNTY with a view toward securing a contract or securing favorable treatment with respect to the awarding or amending or making of any determinations with respect to the performance of this Contract.
2. In the event this Contract is terminated as provided in paragraph 1 hereof, COUNTY shall be entitled:
 - a. to pursue the same remedies against PROVIDER as it could pursue in the event of a breach of this Contract by PROVIDER; and
 - b. as a penalty in addition to any other damages to which it may be entitled by law, to exemplary damages in an amount (as determined by COUNTY) which shall be not less than three (3) nor more than ten (10) times the costs incurred by PROVIDER in providing any such gratuities to any such officer or employee.
3. The rights and remedies of COUNTY provided in this clause shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Contract.

H. Audits

The performance of this Contract by PROVIDER is subject to review by COUNTY to insure contract compliance. PROVIDER agrees to provide COUNTY any and all information requested that relates to the performance of this Contract. All requests for information will be in writing to PROVIDER. Time is of the essence during the audit process. Failure to provide the information requested within the timeline provided in the written information request may be considered a material breach of Contract and be cause for suspension and/or termination of the Contract.

I. Covenant

PROVIDER covenants that it presently has no interest and that it will not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required to be performed under this Contract. PROVIDER further covenants, to its knowledge and ability, that in the performance of said services no person having any such interest shall be employed.

J. Confidential Treatment of Information

PROVIDER shall preserve in strict confidence any information obtained, assembled or prepared in connection with the performance of this Contract.

K. ADA Requirements

All work performed or services rendered by PROVIDER shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act standards adopted by Clark County. All facilities built prior to January 26, 1992 must comply with the Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards; and all facilities completed after January 26, 1992 must comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines.

L. Subcontractor Information

PROVIDER shall provide a list of the Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE), Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE), Physically-Challenged Business Enterprise (PBE), Small Business Enterprise (SBE), Veteran Business Enterprise (VET), Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVET), and Emerging Small Business Enterprise (ESB) subcontractors for this Contract utilizing the attached format (Exhibit C). The information provided in Exhibit C by PROVIDER is for COUNTY'S information only.

M. Disclosure of Ownership Form

PROVIDER agrees to provide the information on the attached Disclosure of Ownership/Principals form prior to any contract and/or contract amendment to be awarded by the Board of County Commissioners.

N. Authority

COUNTY is bound only by COUNTY agents acting within the actual scope of their authority. COUNTY is not bound by actions of one who has apparent authority to act for COUNTY. The acts of COUNTY agents which exceed their contracting authority do not bind COUNTY.

O. Force Majeure

PROVIDER shall be excused from performance hereunder during the time and to the extent that it is prevented from obtaining, delivering, or performing, by acts of God, fire, war, loss or shortage of transportation facilities, lockout or commandeering of raw materials, products, plants or facilities by the government. PROVIDER shall provide COUNTY satisfactory evidence that nonperformance is due to cause other than fault or negligence on its part.

P. Severability

If any terms or provisions of CONTRACT shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, then such term or provision shall be deemed stricken and the remaining portions of CONTRACT shall remain in full force and effect.

Q. Non-Endorsement

As a result of the selection of PROVIDER to supply goods or services, COUNTY is neither endorsing nor suggesting that PROVIDER'S service is the best or only solution. PROVIDER agrees to make no reference to COUNTY in any literature, promotional material, brochures, sales presentations, or the like, without the express written consent of COUNTY.

R. Public Records

COUNTY is a public agency as defined by state law, and as such, is subject to the Nevada Public Records Law (Chapter 239 of the Nevada Revised Statutes). Under the law, all of COUNTY'S records are public records (unless otherwise declared by law to be confidential) and are subject to inspection and copying by any person. All bid documents are available for review following the bid opening.

EXHIBIT A
BRIDGE HOUSING PROGRAM SERVICES
SCOPE OF WORK

1. SCOPE OF WORK:

- A. PROVIDER shall provide room and board housing to individuals and families who require temporary housing placement until permanent housing options are identified.
- B. PROVIDER shall provide housing in one or more geographic areas of Clark County, including the outlying towns of Searchlight, Laughlin, Overton, Sandy Valley, Mesquite, Logandale, Jean, and the Moapa Indian Reservation, as well as in the Metropolitan Las Vegas area which includes Boulder City, Henderson, North Las Vegas, and Las Vegas. PROVIDER shall be available on week-ends, COUNTY holidays and evening hours, as well as during normal working hours between 7:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday. PROVIDER(s) must provide services within twelve (12) hours of COUNTY or authorized COUNTY representatives (such as subcontractors) request.
- C. Housing may include hotel/motel rooms and single room occupancy (SRO) facilities for chronically homeless families with children, adult families, and single adults. The program is designed to offer temporary housing assistance to the target population of which a member will be recently discharged from the hospital and require ongoing medical treatment provided by Medicaid and/or private insurance.
- D. PROVIDER'S services shall be provided to eligible residents without charge to the resident and without restrictions on the length of stay for the entire length of the contract period. PROVIDER will not cause the displacement or relocation of existing residential tenants, and shall not have any significant environmental issues (i.e., where hazardous materials are present that cannot be adapted safely by the PROVIDER at no additional cost to COUNTY).
- E. PROVIDER shall provide fully furnished units, preferably with a kitchenette or other cooking facility, and a refrigerator (mandatory) of a size appropriate for the housing unit to store food and medication for qualified Guests (tenants), referred by COUNTY or our authorized representative 24 hours per day, seven (7) days a week as needed.
- F. Although standalone sites are preferred, the COUNTY will also consider units in multiple buildings that are scattered throughout Clark County. COUNTY will not consider individual rooms located within a private residence, single family homes, two family homes, townhouses, or similar low-density housing.
- G. PROVIDER shall recognize the following is a general description of the physical nature of each housing category:
 - Family with Minor Children (under the age of 18)

A family unit houses homeless families with children in residential units with its own private bathroom and optional cooking facility. The unit must be in accordance with all applicable county and city ordinances, laws, and be up to current building codes and is ADA compliant.
 - Single, Couple and Adult Family all without Minor Children (under the age of 18)

Housing for a single person, a couple or an adult family, none of which have minor children. Adult families must be housed in their own private unit. Housing must be in accordance with all applicable county and city ordinances, law, and be up to current building codes and is ADA compliant.
- H. COUNTY prefers that PROVIDERS can present their housing options as a turnkey project. A turnkey project is a housing option that provides amenities which may include but is not limited to a cooking area, towels, sheets, furnishings, housekeeping.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. Operate a housing program including hotels/motels/SRO facilities that provides access 24 hours a day 7 days a week.
- B. Work with Case Management staff from local service providers to provide ADA compliant housing options for the target population.

- C. Provide the following:
1. Clean, safe, properly ventilated, air conditioned and heated facility;
 2. Access to restrooms, wash basins, showers with hot and cold running water, and a refrigerator;
 3. Storage space for personal items;
 4. Utilities to include Electric, Water, and/or Gas if applicable;
 5. Free local calling;
 6. Must meet all federal, State and local fire codes and regulations.
- D. Be ADA compliant.
- E. Be available for consultation regarding the operation and progress of the PROVIDER with all parties to the funding agreement, and at such other reasonable times with advance notice as to not conflict with PROVIDER's other responsibilities.
- F. Implement a quality assurance component to facilitate client feedback on quality of services, which must include at least one of the following:
1. Satisfaction surveys given to the Client by the PROVIDER to be returned directly to COUNTY. Said surveys shall be provided to the Client at the completion of service delivery. A stamped self-addressed envelope shall be provided to the client with each survey;
 2. Regularly scheduled meetings with COUNTY personnel to discuss client satisfaction.
- PROVIDER will submit a written procedure for implementing the client feedback mechanism(s), and report on its progress quarterly. PROVIDER shall provide written notice to COUNTY of any changes to the feedback mechanism during the term of the agreement including any extensions thereto.
- G. Housing Criteria.
- The housing must be decent, safe, sanitary and in accordance with Housing Quality Standards. These standards include all of the following:
- a. An alternative exit in case of fire;
 - b. Optional, A cooking stove or range;
 - c. Optional, A kitchen sink with hot and cold running water;
 - d. A refrigerator that is of appropriate size for the unit;
 - e. Optional, Space for storage, food preparation and serving;
 - f. Optional, Facilities and services for food waste disposal;
 - g. At least one window in living and sleeping rooms;
 - h. A working light fixture in the bathroom and optional kitchen;
 - i. Optional, A minimum of two electric outlets in the kitchen, living room and each bedroom;
 - j. Adequate air circulation;
 - k. Free from dangerous levels of sewer gas, carbon monoxide dust, fuel gas and other harmful air pollutants;
 - l. A flush toilet;
 - m. A fixed tub or shower with hot and cold running water;
 - n. A fixed basin with hot and cold running water;
 - o. A kitchen (optional), living room (optional), bathroom and at least one bedroom or a living-sleeping room;
 - p. Optional, Screens on all exterior doors and windows that are accessible from the outside;
 - q. No serious defects such as large holes, bulging or loose surface materials, on floors, ceilings, and walls;
 - r. A firm and weather tight roof.
- H. PROVIDER shall report to the OWNER, within 24 hours, any situation such as a change in occupancy, death, illness, injury or accident, fire, or other matters which would necessitate a prompt response by PROVIDER and immediate interest to the COUNTY.

- I. PROVIDER shall be subject to a continuous evaluation process by COUNTY including but not limited to basic administrative standards (i.e., punctuality in submitting required administrative data and correct administrative procedure). Unsatisfactory evaluation results that remain uncorrected for 10 working days after COUNTY has given written notice shall establish sufficient cause for COUNTY to immediately terminate this Contract.

**EXHIBIT B
BRIDGE HOUSING PROGRAM SERVICES
INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONTRACT DOCUMENT, PROVIDER SHOULD FORWARD THE FOLLOWING INSURANCE CLAUSE AND SAMPLE INSURANCE FORM TO THEIR INSURANCE AGENT PRIOR TO PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL.

- A. **Format/Time**: PROVIDER shall provide COUNTY with Certificates of Insurance, per the sample format (page B-3), for coverage as listed below, and endorsements affecting coverage required by this Contract within **ten (10) business days** after COUNTY's written request for insurance. All policy certificates and endorsements shall be signed by a person authorized by that insurer and who is licensed by the State of Nevada in accordance with NRS 680A.300. All required aggregate limits shall be disclosed and amounts entered on the Certificate of Insurance, and shall be maintained for the duration of the Contract and any renewal periods.
- B. **Best Key Rating**: COUNTY requires insurance carriers to maintain during the Contract term, a Best Key Rating of A.VII or higher, which shall be fully disclosed and entered on the Certificate of Insurance.
- C. **Owner Coverage**: COUNTY, its officers and employees must be expressly covered as additional insured's except on Workers' Compensation. PROVIDER'S insurance shall be primary as respects COUNTY, its officers and employees.
- D. **Endorsement/Cancellation**: PROVIDER'S general liability and automobile liability insurance policy shall be endorsed to recognize specifically PROVIDER'S contractual obligation of additional insured to COUNTY and must note that COUNTY will be given thirty (30) calendar days advance notice by certified mail "return receipt requested" of any policy changes, cancellations, or any erosion of insurance limits. ***Separate copies of additional insured endorsements are required and must be attached to any certificate of insurance. Policy number must be referenced on endorsement or the form number must be referenced on certificate.***
- E. **Deductibles**: All deductibles and self-insured retentions shall be fully disclosed in the Certificates of Insurance and may not exceed \$25,000. *If the deductible is "zero" it must still be referenced on the certificate.*
- F. **Aggregate Limits**: If aggregate limits are imposed on bodily injury and property damage, then the amount of such limits must not be less than \$2,000,000.
- G. **Commercial General Liability**: Subject to Paragraph F of this Exhibit, PROVIDER shall maintain limits of no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury (including death), personal injury and property damages. Commercial general liability coverage shall be on a "per occurrence" basis only, not "claims made," and be provided either on a Commercial General Liability or a Broad Form Comprehensive General Liability (including a Broad Form CGL endorsement) insurance form. Policies must contain a primary and non-contributory clause and must contain a waiver of subrogation endorsement. ***A separate copy of the waiver of subrogation endorsement must be provided. A separate copy of the additional insured endorsement is required and must be provided for Commercial General Liability. Policy number must be referenced on endorsement or the form number must be referenced on certificate.***
- H. **Automobile Liability**: Subject to Paragraph F of this Exhibit, PROVIDER shall maintain limits of no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage to include, but not be limited to, coverage against all insurance claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from services rendered by PROVIDER and **any auto** used for the performance of services under this Contract. ***A separate copy of the additional insured endorsement is required and must be provided for Automobile Liability policies. Policy number must be referenced on endorsement or the form number must be referenced on certificate.***
- I. **Workers' Compensation**: PROVIDER shall obtain and maintain for the duration of this Contract, a work certificate and/or a certificate issued by an insurer qualified to underwrite workers' compensation insurance in the State of Nevada, in accordance with Nevada Revised Statutes Chapters 616A-616D, inclusive, provided, however, a PROVIDER that is a Sole Proprietor shall be required to submit an affidavit (Attachment 1) indicating that PROVIDER has elected not to be included in the terms, conditions and provisions of Chapters 616A-616D, inclusive, and is otherwise in compliance with those terms, conditions and provisions.
- J. **Failure To Maintain Coverage**: If PROVIDER fails to maintain any of the insurance coverage required herein, COUNTY may withhold payment, order PROVIDER to stop the work, declare PROVIDER in breach, suspend or terminate the Contract.
- K. **Additional Insurance**: PROVIDER is encouraged to purchase any such additional insurance as it deems necessary.
- L. **Damages**: PROVIDER is required to remedy all injuries to persons and damage or loss to any property of COUNTY, caused in whole or in part by PROVIDER, their subcontractors or anyone employed, directed or supervised by PROVIDER.
- M. **Cost**: PROVIDER shall pay all associated costs for the specified insurance. The cost shall be included in the price(s).
