1. The Bureau of Land Management will provide a briefing on Gold Butte, as well as activities in the north east area (for possible action)

Provide a summary of the report/discussion

Commissioner Marilyn Kirkpatrick- has been working with the BLM for approximately 1 year on a variety of issues including rights of way and utilities. BLM met with Metro and County about how to reengage with the community. Stipulations were set forth that BLM had to do. Fix breaches in Moapa, maintain roads, repeater repaired, attend Town Boards etc. There will be a meeting Sept. 7 to discuss what folks would like to see in Gold Butte i.e. camp grounds or historical preservation etc. *BLM-* they are currently trying to catch up on work and are working on how to move forward. Sergeant Empey was able to give them communities perspective. There are 3 categories that they are currently working on. (1) Land Management- land use authorizations will be amongst the highest priorities (2) Public Safety- certain areas haven't recovered from the fire in 2005-2006 fuel treatments will start around October. Will put an herbicide on non-native grasses that burn easily and replace with native seeds on approx. 80 acres. (3) Community Outreach- put a proposal for a grant to be able to restore disturbances to cultural features. Will identify where campsites, restrooms and infrastructure is needed. The BLM's message is they will start slowly and get important projects completed. *TAB member-* is there plans to repave the road at Whitney Pockets? *Janice-* No, just up to White Rock for now. *Jaina-* appreciates the wide open spaces and beauty is what attracted her to the area and has learned that people here share the same sentiment. *Joe-* What's so important at White Rock for it to need to be paved? *Marilyn-* it was on a previous list and Marilyn is trying to fulfill requests made. *Joe-* is the area going to be shut off to 4 wheelers? *BLM-* No. *Duane-* 5 good men are in jail and he despises the BLM and will take a long time to forgive. What's the situation with the cattle? *BLM-* there's been no discussion on his level as to what will happen with the cattle. *TAB-* is the livestock gathering going to happen? *BLM-* There's been no direction as of yet. *Briana-* Husband is in a federal facility. Land is loved and managed by her family BLM hasn't been present in the community for 20 years. Waters are still being damaged; brother in law spends countless hours daily repairing the water lines that were destroyed. 26 children were impacted. BLM is not welcome.

Janice- a decision doesn't need to be made tonight but would like the board to put together a wish list. Example: trails around parks, video equipment, Wi-Fi etc.
TAB member- is the gas tax the only source of income? *Janice-* Yes. *Marilyn-* If the fuel tax is passed, NDOT dollars will stay. Urges board that roads should be on a different list. Marilyn was able to get a grant writer for the rural areas and will focus on recreational things. Would like the board to present her with a broad list. Expansion of the cemetery is on the list. *Janice-* needs to put this together by October. *TAB member-* appreciates the trail because he and many others use it.
