VII. General Business

1. Code Enforcement Committee (for discussion and possible action)

The board discussed a previous committee previously utilized to make visits to resident's homes and offer assistance to bring their property up to code (mostly with disabled or elderly). This applied primarily to weeds and other projects that could be given to scout troops so they could perform their community service duties. Board member, Gene Houston, wants to be sure that the committee is formed as a help to the community that will not act as enforcement. Janice will work on gathering information on how the previous committee operated and will bring this item before the board in the near future.

2. Southern Nevada Cooperative Weed Management Area to discuss weed management and cost share assistance program for landowners (for discussion and possible action)

Jonny Jones discussed the details and purpose of the weed management program (SNCWMA). Their partnerships include landowners, businesses and state and local agencies. Their aim is to provide education and a cost share assistance program for those businesses and individuals who spend money on preventative steps to fight obnoxious and invasive weeds. Money spent includes hiring a company to maintain weeds or the private purchase of herbicides and other preventative care purchases. Expenses can be reimbursed up to 50% but not exceeding \$200. In order to access the monies available the interested business or individual is required to become a member and sign the memorandum of understanding.

3. Elaine Williams to discuss formation of committee for Hidden Heroes program and whether Moapa Valley is interested in becoming a Hidden Heroes community (for discussion and possible action)

Elaine desires to bring Hidden Heroes to the community that will serve as a great resource for the caregivers of our veterans. She has been training with the Veterans Resource Transition Center that helps provide information and resources for caregivers. Elaine has spoken with Joe Perez and he is a big supporter of the program. Board members suggested her speak with the VFW, Vernon Robison and continue to communicate with Joe Perez. Elaine plans to start her committee and program by September.

Board went over last fiscal year's requests. They are requesting the budget meetings to be advertised in advance
