4. Receive a report from Clark County Administrative services regarding an update on State Route 160 construction, applications for the 2017-2019 CAC term are being accepted, and other updates from Clark County (for discussion only).  
Meggan spoke with Jack Sjostrom at the CA Group and was informed that Phase I should be completed by February/March 2017. Phase II is currently in the design plan phase and will be provided to NDOT by Thanksgiving. We should receive the completed design plan sometime around March 2017. Phase II construction should be starting around July 2017 or later. The existing mailboxes will be relocated and the old mailboxes on the side of the road will be eliminated. Jack mentioned that yesterday's fatality, which included a dump truck towing a bobcat that lost its brakes, did not have a direct connection to the road work construction. CAC Board Member positions are up for renewal for the term 2017-2019. Applications can be filled out online and must be completed by November 15<sup>th</sup>.
5. Revise bylaws to comport with NRS provisions on election of or appointment of members and Board of County Commissioners' agenda standardization requirement. (for possible action).  
Copies of the new changes to the Bylaws were handed out, none of which affect our community. One new law is that the following town board members are now elected to the board: Moapa, Moapa Valley, Bunkerville, Searchlight, and Laughlin. (No action required)
6. Nominate a representative (and possible alternate) to serve on the Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC) (for possible action). Meggan will check with Tanya to see if she is interested in this position. No others volunteered.
7. Receive community input regarding Clark County budget requests for next funding year (for possible action).  
Budget requests were: 8" water line from the water tank to the highway with a fire hydrant for filling the fire trucks, culverts on Benedict Rd. for drainage/flood control.

VI. Comments by the General Public

Bruce requested some dumpsters be delivered and Meggan will talk to Republic Services to find a weekend that works for us. She will email the information once she knows the date. Appy mentioned the blocked culvert/pipe behind the fire station. Meggan stated that she has researched that situation before and neither NDOT nor Clark County Public Works claimed ownership of the pipe. She will look into it again.
