MEETING MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

- A. Please silence all electronic devices and take all private conversations outside the room.

III. REPORTS

- A. Administrative Services – **Janice** said that the person she had planned to come out to discuss the Bundy issue is getting ready to retire, so she has to decide what's next. **Nephi** said they should come talk to them to assure it doesn't happen like that again. **Janice** said she would do everything she can to get someone from the new regime because that's who needs to talk to you.
- B. Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. – **Mark** said that overall it has not been busy in either the Virgin or Moapa Valleys.
- C. Parks and Recreation. **John Stastny** stated they are getting ready for their after school program. Real Property Management has installed two new pumps in the splash pad, He was asked when the splash pad would be shut down and stated that RPM makes that decision, usually based on the temperature. He also said that if anyone has any ideas for programs they want, to discuss them with Gail Lindsay.

IV. COMMUNITY CONCERNS

- A. Receive comments from the public on neighborhood issues or problems and direct concern to the appropriate organization
Street Lights to be repaired: Can someone come out at night to take a look at all the lights that are out..
Roads for paving and maintenance **None**.
Public Comments – Can they put up barriers to stop ATVs on the pedestrian portion of the bridge. **Mark** said they would be a safety problem.

V. GENERAL BUSINESS

- A. **Discussion regarding obtaining additional land for the Bunkerville Cemetery. For possible action. Stephen** said his father, Michael Waite, is the sexton and says the cemetery will not be filled within his lifetime. Stephen thinks the community could take the cemetery over from the County. If the County would buy the land on the east side, they could begin the process of how to take it over. Six years ago the asking price of the property was \$35K. When we hit capacity, it would be nice to have the extra land.
- B. **Discussion regarding elements wanted in a potential Bunkerville Park upgrade. For possible action. Stephen** said that Victoria had asked him about projects for SNPLMA funds. They had talked about the bike path and the upgrade of the park pavilion. They would like to upgrade the fence. **Brian** said they can upgrade the fence now. **Nephi** asked if they put a walk around the park, can they tie it to the trail. **John Stastny** said they have always wanted a trail around the park and would like to see something with the soft tarmac. Due to funding issues, it was suggested they break the projects up into smaller pieces.
- C. **Discussion regarding the concrete pipes on the D. biasi property on Riverside Road. For possible action. Mark** said they talked about this several years ago and that Code Enforcement was involved. At that time David said he was going to build and needed the pipes. It was decided we should review what happened and go from there. They asked Janice to have Cindy and Tammy to come talk to them.

Duane asked Jim Cannon of Wheeler Electric to come talk about the lights on the trail. Jim said there is one light that is bad and sometimes they come on early. He explained how they work. They really are not using a lot of power because they are LED.

Ryan Bundy talked about the issue of his children being pulled from the school district. He said the main issue was the publicity surrounding his decision. It should have been just between him and the school, but someone at the school contacted the media. He explained his belief about the knife issue, and the police presence at the school. **Stephen** suggested he speak to the principal regarding the issues and stated they would really like to see his kids back in school.
