DRAFT MEETING MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

II. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION

- A. Adoption of the Agenda.. **MOTION TO APPROVE AGENDA. MOTION PASSED, UNANIMOUS**
- B. Approval of draft minutes for march 31, 2015. Lyn stated that she may have misspoken when speaking of the park tax and called it a bond. The minutes should be corrected to reflect that it is a tax not a bond. **MOTION TO APPROVE AS CORRECTED. UNANIMOUS**

III. GENERAL BUSINESS

- A. Approve letter of support for a security resource officer for the Moapa and Moapa Valley schools – for possible action. **Dr. Shari Lyman** provided a copy of the letter written by the Moapa Valley TAB to use as an example. She suggested it also be sent to LVMPD, Pat Skorkowski, and Chris Garvey. **Lyn** stated that usually the requestor brings the letter to the Board for approval. **Lyn** will write the letter for the Board and bring it to the next meeting. **Tim** said that he was told after the last meeting that we had had an officer approved in the past and we refused it. He said that may be an issue that will come up.
- B. Discuss the previously developed paving priority list and other issues surrounding paving in Moapa – for possible action. **Tim** stated what the current priority list contained. **Lyn** stated that it doesn't match what the County is doing. **Tim** said the feedback is that the paving on Isola should not go forward. **Bob Lyman** offered an explanation of what "pulverize and pave" means as stated in the engineering contract. He said they would not bring in any new material and that's a problem because the roads in Moapa do not currently have a structural base. He said that in Las Vegas valley it would cost ~\$170/ft of road for just the asphalt. On Sim they would need to do a great deal more. **Lyn** recommended they focus on Sim to do it correctly and not take a band-aid approach. She said that Janice wanted a recommendation. **Moved and seconded to recommend the County provide a fully engineered paved road from the base up and to delay paving Isola. UNANIMOUS.** **Tim** said they need to revisit the paving list and he will put it on a future agenda.
- C. Discuss the issue of school bus stops on Hwy 168. **Shari Lyman** stated that Janice had stated that individuals under the age of 18 cannot clean up along Hwy 168. She said that if that is the case then why do we have them walk to a bus stop on 168? Some families have been fighting for a safer bus stop for quite some time. A citizen stated that when her son was in elementary school the bus stop was in a good place. The School District moved it when he went into Middle School. It was suggested that a letter to the School District be written regarding bus stops and be brought to the next meeting.
