I. CALL TO ORDER

 1. Administrative Services: **Janice** reported that the washouts on the trail have been repaired. Purchasing will send the Cooper Bridge Project out for bids this week. At the worst case scenario the construction will begin in six months.

IV. GENERAL BUSINESS

- A. Discussion and possible action on licensing and operation of ATV and OHV's. **Janice** stated that she had spoken with Sue Baker who is coordinating an effort to register OHVs in the valley. The issue is who to get to verify the serial numbers. NHP can do it, but Janice is trying to coordinate with the Northeast Area Command of Metro to provide the service. **Ralph Starita** said the Sgt. Empey had said that he had been told by his management to not provide this service. **Elise McAllister** said that the law provides for the dealers to do this. **Janice** is trying to set it up for someone to be here several Saturdays so people can get their ATV/OHVs licensed. **Elise** said local NDOT is awaiting a response from Carson City regarding where they will allow ATV/OHVs to cross Moapa Valley Blvd. **Elise** will put a map together and provide it to Janice. **Martin Conley** asked what the rules are to ride on our streets. For the most part the community is OHV friendly.
- B. Discussion and possible action on ensuring trails are developed in conjunction with the Flood Control Master Plan for the Muddy River. **Janice** started off by saying there is no money for trails. That being said she is concerned about the flood control project and the concrete wall that will be put in by the levee. She asked if everyone is on board to get the levee fixed so the Flood Insurance rates can go down. She explained what was discussed at the meeting she went to regarding trails and the flood control projects. The projects must have a maintenance road and that road can be turned in to a trail. **Gene** stated that the plans have always been to have the trail down by the water at least in some places. **Ryan Wheeler** made a power point presentation regarding the questions he has about the trails along the river. **Janice** stated she will set up a meeting and asked if it would be better to hold it out here or in town. **Gene** said he would go either place but did not want it to turn in to an argument about the flood control project; it should be just about the trails in conjunction with the project.
- C. Resolution to support Elise McAllister, Administrator for Partners in Conservation, to be reappointed to the Dispersed Recreation Seat on the BLM's Mojave-Southern Great Basic Resource Advisory Council – for possible action. **Gene** read the resolution supporting Elise for appointment to this Council. **Elise** said she would appreciate the support to continue the work started. **Gene** disclosed he is on the Board of Partners in Conservation for whom Elise works. **Ralph Starita** stated that the board should approve the recommendation. **Janice** stated that Commissioner Collins is supporting this resolution. **A MOTION WAS MADE AND SECONDED TO SUPPORT THE RESOLUTION. Gene signed the document and gave to Elise.**

If any member of the Board wishes to extend the length of a presentation, the Chairman of the Board will do this by majority vote. If you wish to speak on a matter not listed as a public hearing or on a matter not posted on the Agenda, you may do so during the Public Comment Session.
