MEETING MINUTES Tuesday, August 14, 2012

This meeting was properly noticed and posted in conformance with the Nevada Open Meeting Law. Chairman Wade Schneiderman called the meeting to order at 7:37 p.m. with a quorum present. CAC Members present were Wade Schneiderman, William Carter, Dave Lowe, and Patrick Lee. Dave Lowe had an excused absence. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Under Organizational Items; a motion made to approve the agenda for August 14, by George, passed. A motion made to approve the minutes of July 10, 2012 by Patrick, passed. Commissioner Brager introduced Meggan Holzer as Sandy Valley's new Liaison. Meggan gave a short biography of herself.

Under Procedures and Conduct; Wade read the Procedures and Conduct.

Under Agency Reports; Chief Smith of SVVFD reported 79 medical and 15 fire calls for the year. He also reported that the SVVFD sponsored blood drive/shot clinic in August was successful. Patrick asked if SVVFD had anyone to send to the Wildland Summit, Ken responded not yet. Wade questioned a survey he received from Clark County Fire regarding our volunteer station. Ken explained the intent of the survey. There were no representatives from metro. Shane Nolan of BLM was available to answer questions. Electra Smith, on behalf of Sandy Valley School, reported that there is progress in the construction of the well and sprinkler system. She also made available a copy of an article in the RJ regarding Moapa receiving votes to put in a new gym. She asked that the community stay in contact with the School Board Members in voicing the needs of Sandy Valley Students. Shawna Robinson of Parks and Recreation stated that her report is the same as last month.

Under Announcements; Wade announced that Apple Home HealthCare Inc. is coming out to Sandy Valley. Cheryl Elumba passed out brochures and explained some of their services.

Under Discussion Items; a motion by George, making John Bacher representative of the Community Development Advisory Committee, seconded by Patrick, passed. A motion by Patrick, making Greg Neff, alternate representative of the Community Development Advisory Committee, seconded by George, passed. Karin Marshall read a letter of community concern regarding the lack of public restrooms in Peace Park. In the letter it goes into detail the usage of the park and its need for a 24 hour restroom. Commissioner Brager stated that she is behind this project and will work with Meggan on it. Debbie Dauenhauer, Executive Director and Michelle Vestal, Administrative Manager, both representatives of Silver Rider, gave a brief description of

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their organization and what it offers. The goal is to get bus services to take elderly shopping to Las Vegas from time to time. Debbie had stated there are federal grants available but with these grants need to be matching local funds. They opened the floor for questions and left their brochures.

There were no Planning and Zoning Items.

Under Liaison Report; Meggan did not have a liaison report. She was happy to invite Silver Rider out to Sandy Valley when she heard what we wanted to accomplish with transporting elderly to town.

There was no Correspondence.

Under Public Comment; Bonnie Schneiderman announced a Grange meeting Thursday night at the Senior Center at 6:00 pm. Bonnie reports she still has tickets for the flag afghan. Mark Hall-Patton, representing the Queho Posse Chapter of E Clampus Vitus announced they will be in Sandy Valley the second weekend of October and they will be dedicating a plaque to Sandy Valley at Joe Beatty's on Sunday, October 14th at 10:00 a.m. Karin Marshall had requested action be taken although action was not necessary on making the Park Restrooms a priority for documentation and record. It was expressed by Commissioner Brager, the park restroom and the Fire Rescue both are priorities. Meggan also reminded everyone that the minutes are public record and are recorded as documentation. Dawn Haviland announced that resident officer Jeff Warner is retiring. She would like to put together a memory book for him, and asked if he touched anyone's life to please send her an email with the information to add to the book. She would like to give it to him in December. Cut off date for stories will be November 15th. She also reported the Jean Justice Court is doing VIN inspections in Sandy Valley due to the new off road vehicle registration law. They will be done by the Court's Bailiffs. She requested you call the Court House and a schedule will be made. Linda Drake announced CATS will be having an Art Show, September 15th from 10am-4pm and applications will be at the Library and Post Office. Dick Drake announced the Pancake Breakfast on Saturday at 8-10:30 am. Dawn Haviland announced a Fundraiser for Koni and Wanda on September 29th to help with expenses as Koni is fighting cancer. This will be an all day event starting with breakfast at the Sandy Valley Ranch, Keystone for lunch sponsored by CATS and dinner sponsored by the seniors. Patrick Lee wanted entered into record that he read in the law that the Golf Cart is not considered an off road vehicle.

The next "regular" meeting is Tuesday, September 11, 2012 unless there is a special call meeting required.

A motion made to adjourn the meeting by George, seconded by William passed; the meeting adjourned at 8:42 pm.

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
