MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, October 8, 2013

This meeting was properly noticed and posted in conformance with the Nevada Open Meeting Law. Chairman Dave Lowe called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. with a quorum present. CAC Members present were Wade Schneiderman, William Carter, and George Odell. Patrick Lee had an unexcused absence. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Under Organizational Items; a motion made to approve the agenda for October 8, 2013, by Wade, seconded by George passed. A motion made to approve the minutes of September 10, 2013 by George, seconded by Wade passed.

Under Procedures and Conduct; Dave summarized the procedures and conduct.

Under Agency Reports; Officer Snook, of Metro, stated that he had nothing to report but asked if there were any questions before he left on a call. With no questions, he left. Ken Smith, Chief of the SVVFD, reported calls for September. He requested that community members do their best not to burn after dark. Breanna Cripe announced the Fall Carnival and Haunted House at Keystone on October 23rd. Electra also reminded everyone to save Box Tops for Education and Campbell's Labels for Education. She also announced that the school was having a change war for Rey Teroy who was recently diagnosed with Leukemia. Dawn Haviland reported that the Keystone Educational Foundation has been asked to work closer with Sandy Valley School; there is a plan of working with School Board Trustee Carolyn Edwards in uniting the community to voice the need for a new school. Stacy Reynolds of Animal Control introduced herself and discussed some standards expected for the care of animals. She made herself available for questions.

Under Discussion Items; Debbie Dauenhauer from the Southern Nevada Transit Coalition discussed the details for the Silver Rider transportation service for Sandy Valley and Goodsprings. She stated that there are surveys throughout the valley asking the community of their needs for transportation; where to go and when. Representatives from Public Works came to confirm road money available and asked the community what their priorities were in road maintenance. There was detailed discussion from several community members on what roads to improve and how to improve them. It was stated that the Sandy Mesquite Valley Development Association already has a road committee called the Trailblazers looking into road problems. A motion by Wade to have a lead committee (Trailblazers) to handle the

surveying of the community on the priorities, seconded by William, passed. It was discussed that the committee would need to follow Open Meeting Law and report back to the CAC. The importance of utilizing this money and the community having a say was expressed. Meggan reported that the BLM Cleanup date is not good for BLM. A motion by Wade to cancel the date of November 9th, seconded by George, passed.

Under Planning and Zoning; there is none.

Under Liaison Report; Meggan passed out maps which listed roads in Sandy Valley that are maintained by Public Works. There was a discrepancy with the maps. Meggan stated she would review them with public works and bring it back for further discussion. Meggan reported Family Dollar Stores are looking to put a store in Sandy Valley; they will be out here on October 22nd from 6:30-7:30 at the Community Center. Meggan met with Regional Flood Control to possibly speak on issues of flooding in Sandy Valley at a CAC meeting. They reported that Sandy Valley does not have any serious flood problems at this time and their involvement is not necessary at this time. Meggan reported that Greg Neff has been appointed to fill the open seat on the Board. His appointment should start on October 15th. Debbie Madril questioned Meggan on the issue where the planning commission had passed Use Permit UC-0226-13 for a mining operation on the property of Rose Beatty when the Sandy Valley CAC Board had denied it; she stated that she was at the meeting and they had said that they did not hear anything from Sandy Valley regarding the subject. Meggan assured her that she herself had given them all specifics and Electra had stated that she faxed over the information as well. Meggan stated that she would look into the new information given.

Under Correspondence; there was no correspondence.

Under Announcements; Linda LeVasseur of the Senior Center announced; SMVDA Bake Sale during the Senior Breakfast on October 19th at 8-10:30am then 2pm Fall Prevention. Texas Hold'em on October 26th; 5pm food and 6pm cards dealt. Valley Electric Picnic on October 10th in the park from 4-7pm. Senior Center hours; M-F 9-5pm and 2-6pm on Saturday. Maria Petras announced the American Legion Oratorical Contest to be held November 5th at 6pm at the Keystone Center, this is open for all High School students and winners receive scholarship money. John Bacher announced the SMVDA Halloween will start at 6pm on October 31st at the park; there will be contest prizes. He also announced a Trailblazers meeting on October 22nd at 7:30pm at Keystone.

Under Public Comment; there were no public comments.

Under Next Meeting Date; the next meeting date is Tuesday, November 12, 2013.

Under Adjournment; a motion made to adjourn the meeting by William, seconded by Wade passed at 9:11pm.
