Under Call to Order; this meeting was properly noticed and posted in conformance with the Nevada Open Meeting Law. Vice Chairman William Carter called the meeting to order at 7:42 p.m. with a quorum present.

Under Pledge of Allegiance; the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Under Roll Call; CAC Members present were Wade Schneiderman, George Odell, Greg Neff, and Dave Lowe.

Under Procedures and Conduct; William read the procedures and conduct.

Officer Snook, of Metro, reported that Metro has a new Sergeant, Newberry. Sergeant Delzer was promoted. Officer Snook regretfully reported the loss of resident officer Eric Leach, who passed suddenly. A question was asked if they will replace Officer Leach, Officer Snook replied not at this time due to lack of manpower and then updated everyone on the resident program. Assistant Principal Dawna Alexander reported on behalf of Sandy Valley School. Principal Lounsbery proudly announced that currently the volleyball and football teams are undefeated. He reported that the High School received a 5 Start rating and explained what this means and passed out information regarding it. Currently the Middle School and Elementary are 3 Stars. He announced that we received the School Board of Trustees approval of a 15,000 square foot gym. Dawn Haviland spoke on behalf of the idea to get more BLM land and a plan for the future. Ken Derschan, CDAC Representative, reported that on September 24th the CDAC applications went out to the public, November 4th will be member orientation, and November 18th members will review the applications. Shawna Robinson, Parks and Rec, reported the months activities and announced the Fall Festival for October 18th at Keystone.

Under Announcements; Linda LeVasseur, with Senior Center, announced senior breakfast at 8am this Saturday with Texas Hold'em at 5pm. Wade Schneiderman, with Grange, announced their meeting on Thursday the 3rd at 6pm at the Senior Center. Under Liaison Report; Meggan reported that public works plans to come back out in mid-December and went into detail on what will still be fixed. Everything being done by spring. CDAC met with Liaisons to see what their communities might want. Commissioner Brager is putting forth a splash pad for Sandy Valley which will come with its own water source and a walking path. It may delay the restrooms but the new water system may be beneficial to that project also. Meggan reported that the cleanup went great and the Student Council did a fantastic job. She reminded all new and current interested parties that CAC applications are ready and due on December 1st. Terms are ending on December 31st. She made available on the back table the Rural Connection Newsletter. Meggan announced that she and Dawn Haviland have been working together with Las Vegas Rock and Public Works to fix some roads that were damaged from the rains, mostly the roads that the rock has been grated away and now are puff dirt. They are trying to bring in some Type II rock to make them passable. Please email Meggan with your concerns. Meggan brought up that the next meeting is on November 11th which is Veterans Day. The board decided to cancel the meeting.
