

Craig Schweisinger was born in Los Angeles, California at the onset of the Baby Boom era. Growing up in the South Bay area and graduating from North Torrance High School, he then attended classes at El Camino Junior College. Craig married his wife, Carolyn, prior to his induction into the U. S. Army, and after his discharge, moved to Hermosa Beach where he completed his education under the G.I. Bill at California State University, Long Beach. He graduated with a B.A. in Business Administration with an option in Marketing.

His daughter, Jennifer, was born prior to taking a position at Xerox Corporation as a Sales Representative. The family then moved to Westminster, California prior to the birth of his son Todd. After receiving his real estate license with emphasis in commercial real estate, Craig took an assignment with regional real estate companies, Ashwill Burke & Company and Arthur Rubloff & Company, selling and leasing industrial properties in Orange County. He recalls, "Interest rates for take out loans on small industrial buildings reached 16½%, it was a tough business at an impossible time." After his stint in the commercial real estate business, Craig purchased an office seating manufacturing business in Los Angeles and independently continued his real estate endeavors for several years.

Passing out flyers in support of a local city council candidate led to serving on the City of Westminster Traffic Commission, which followed an appointment to the Planning Commission. Asked to run for a City Council seat, Craig was elected to a four year term and as such served as Mayor Pro Tem, Vice Chairman of the Redevelopment Agency, and Chairman of West Orange County Television Authority. Craig also served on numerous boards, committees, and commissions on behalf of the Board of Supervisors for the County of Orange during his council term and after. Upon leaving office he took an assignment on behalf of the City Council serving as the Citizen Member of the Area Variance Committee until moving to Sun City Anthem in Henderson in mid 2006.

Since moving to Henderson, Craig has enjoyed working at The Bass Pro Shop in Las Vegas, volunteering as a Fishing Instructor with the Nevada Department of Wildlife, and as an on call worker at the Las Vegas Convention & Visitors Authority.

Craig is one of four Citizen Members of the Air Pollution Control Hearing Board. He was first appointed by the Clark County Board of County Commissioners in July 2012. His term expires August 10, 2018.
