Dust obscures downtown Las Vegas and the Strip, as seen Monday afternoon from the intersection of Pecos Road and the Las Vegas Beltway. Winds gusting up to 55 mph deposited layers of dust and allergens around the Las Vegas Valley, prompting the National Weather Service to issue a wind advisory through 3 a.m. today. Less powerful winds are expected today, which should help clear out any remaining dust particles in the air. Temperatures are expected to drop significantly today and Wednesday, with highs reaching the mid- to high 60s before rebounding back to normal by the weekend.

It's a windy, dusty Monday

High winds are sweeping into the Las Vegas Valley, depositing layers of dust and allergens.

As strong western and northwestern winds battered the area Monday, the National Weather Service issued a wind advisory for the valley and surrounding areas, to remain in effect until 3 a.m. Tuesday.

The winds are expected to reach 20 to 30 mph with gusts of 40 to 55 mph in the afternoon and then settle down throughout the night.

The Clark County Department of Air Quality also issued an air quality advisory because of the high levels of dust suspended in the air.

Drivers are advised to use caution, as there is decreased visibility on the roads. Boaters at Lake Mead are cautioned to remain near shore, as the winds could cause rough water and large waves.

A low pressure system dropping south out of the Pacific Northwest will bring strong west winds to the area through tonight. The strongest widespread winds will be this afternoon and evening.

High Wind Warning remains in effect until 3 am PDT Tuesday.

A High Wind Warning remains in effect for Northwest San Bernardino County until 3 am PDT Tuesday.

- Winds: West winds 35 to 45 mph with gusts 55 to 65 mph.
- Timing: winds will remain strong through this morning before peaking again this afternoon and evening. Winds will gradually decrease early Tuesday morning.
- Locations: Barstow, Daggett, Fort Irwin.
- Impacts: difficult driving conditions can be expected along area roadways including Highway 395 and Interstates 15 and 40. Widespread blowing dust and sand will reduce visibility. Gusts over 58 mph can lead to property damage.

Recommended actions

Drivers of Motorcycles, vans, campers, trailers, and any High- profile vehicle should be alert to the danger of these winds. Especially when driving along north south roads such as Highway 395. Use extra caution. Secure loose or lightweight outdoor objects.



Watch **Warning**

Wind speeds forecast to meet or exceed locally defined warning criteria in the next 12 to 48 hours. (Typical values are sustained wind speeds of 40 mph or greater lasting for 1 hour or longer, or winds of 58 mph or greater for any duration).
