- **Technician Requests – Jim Arnold**
 - New items or addition of special inspectors are not to be turned in with the annual renewal per TG-16.
 - Inspectors that have not attained the certifications needed to comply with TG-17 will have their approvals revised.
- **Concrete Issue – Jim Arnold**
 - Mix designs more than 1 year old will not be approved. Many are dated January 1, 2011. If you have any that are more than 1 year old, they should be updated.
- **Fees – Jim Arnold**
 - All check that are submitte to CCDDS-BD must be accoppaniced with the backup paperwork, ie; NOV, fee letter, inspector request, or appliaciton.
 - No personal check may be dropped off unless an appointment is made with Carol Carter, carolc@clarkcountynv.gov
- **TG-50 Update – Final and Daily Report Requirements – Brian Lenihan**
 - CCDDS-BD held a meeting with industry to review proposed changes to TG-50.
 - The draft of TG-50 is on the website with the proposed modifications.
- **Epoxy Proof Loading Program– Brian Lenihan**
 - Simpson SET-XP (ESR-2508). When the calculations assume continuous special inspection, a proof loading program is required. Section 4.4.2
- **IAS requirement – Brian Lenihan**
 - Clark County has received and compiled the feedback from industry. A letter to industry concerning the implantation of the IAS accreditation requirements will be issued later this month.
- **Enforcement Issues – Brian Lenihan**
 - QAA Item G – Final cannot contain statements that call for additional inspection requirements.
 - Pad Re-Certifications must address the mass grading and the new site conditions.
 - Final Reports for complex projects must address the work performed. Reports that do not address the project specifics will be deemed inaccurate.
