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NOTIFICATION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CLARK COUNTY CODE, CHAPTER 16.08, SECTIONS 16.08.110 AND 16.08.120 REGARDING NEWSRACKS

Dear Licensees and Community Partners:

Please be notified pursuant to NRS 237.080, that the Clark County Department of Public Works, in response to recommendations made by the Resort Corridor Workgroup, has proposed amendments to Clark County Code Chapter 16.08 to provide for uniformity of newsracks on Las Vegas Boulevard by replacing the current system that provides for installation and maintenance of newsracks by permittees with a County-owned and maintained system of newsracks. The amendments are available for your review online at:

Specifically, the proposed amendments would allow the County to revoke existing locations for permitted privately-owned newsracks and replace them with County-owned newsracks within the permitted area. Pursuant to the proposed amendments, upon completion of a County-owned structure, the current permit holders at a particular location will be permitted to distribute publications from the structure. The permitted area is the public right-of-way in the area zoned PF of Paradise Road between Sahara and Twain, or of Desert Inn Road between Paradise Road and Cambridge Street or of Joe W. Brown Drive or Convention Center Drive, of zoned RVP on Circus Circus Drive, or on any public right-of-way area located in an area zoned as H-1 under the Clark County Code.


In accordance with NRS 237.080, business owners and interested parties may submit data and arguments to the Clark County Board of Commissioners, in care of the Department of Business License as to whether the proposed amendments will:

1. Impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a business; or
2. Directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a business.

The Business Impact Statement will be presented to the Board of County Commissioners at their regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, May 6, 2014, and a public hearing will be set to discuss this proposed ordinance at the Board's regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, May 20, 2014.
