SUMMARY – An ordinance amending Chapter 6.12 of the Clark County Code by adding a new subsection 6.12.447 – Drivers – Independent Contractors to require drivers who are independent contractors to obtain a business license; establish a business license fee for such drivers; and providing for other matters properly relating thereto.

(Of Clark County, Nevada)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6.12 OF THE CLARK COUNTY CODE BY ADDING A NEW SUBSECTION 6.12.447 – DRIVERS – INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS TO REQUIRE DRIVERS WHO ARE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS TO OBTAIN A BUSINESS LICENSE; ESTABLISH A BUSINESS LICENSE FEE FOR SUCH DRIVERS; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF CLARK, STATE OF NEVADA, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. Chapter 6.12 of the Clark County Code is hereby amended by adding a new Subsection 6.12.447 as follows:

Section 6.12.447 – Drivers – Independent Contractors

Any natural person who is an independent contractor rather than an employee of a business licensed by this Department and who transports goods, services and/or passengers within Clark County for any type of compensation must obtain a business license and pay an annual license fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). This subsection does not apply to any natural person who provides interstate transportation of goods, services and/or passengers and is exempt from licensure or assessment of fees by local governments pursuant to any applicable interstate commerce laws or regulations.

The business license required by this subsection may be suspended, revoked or terminated if the Department becomes aware, after the license was issued, that an Independent Contractor Driver:

- (a) Has any change in his or her address, driver's license or motor vehicle registration without notifying the Department within thirty (30) days after the date of change; or
- (b) Has any change in his or her driving history or criminal history, including arrests punishable as gross misdemeanors or felonies.

SECTION TWO. If any section of this ordinance or portion thereof is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate the remaining parts of this ordinance.

SECTION THREE. All ordinances, parts of ordinances, chapters, sections, subsections, clauses, phrases or sentences contained in the Clark County Code in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and the publication thereof by title only, together with the names of the County Commissioners voting for or against its passage, in a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in Clark County, Nevada, at least once a week for a period of two (2) weeks.




