
## 3 Program Completion

## WHAT IS THE CORONER'S VISITATION PROGRAM?

The Coroner's Visitation Program consists of two distinct classes. One is designed for at-risk youths who have committed an act involving the threat or use of force against self or others. The other targets youths who have demonstrated a disregard for their own—or others'—safety and well-being by engaging in risky or reckless behavior.

## WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

This program is designed to deter future violent and unsafe behaviors of at-risk youth by exposing them to the stark consequences of actions resulting in death. Through their discussion of actual case histories from Las Vegas and viewing personal tragedy, they will have an opportunity to examine their own decision-making in an effort to save the lives of themselves and others.


### Program Outline

- Orientation and purpose of the Coroner's Office
- Review of case histories
- Tour of the Coroner's Office
- Class discussion and written responses
- Contract for Change and award of certificate of completion

## HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Students will begin in the classroom. First, they will learn the purpose of the Coroner's Office and review the case histories of those who have lost their lives due to violent and unsafe actions. They will then take a Coroner-led tour in which they experience the sights, smells, and scenes common to the Coroner's Office. Students will not see an autopsy. However, they will be exposed to scenes of untimely or violent death, as well as the tragedy and loss resulting from reckless behavior.

Following the tour, participants will be asked to provide written answers to questions regarding their experience. They will also be given the opportunity to complete a "contract for change." Certificates will be awarded upon successful completion of the class. Prior to leaving the program, students will be encouraged to express their reactions to the experience.

## STEPS TO COMPLETE THE CLASS:

### 1 Court or Parent Referral

Juveniles must attend the program if the court or a parole or probation officer has referred them to participate. Also, parents may also enroll their child who is between 14 and 22 years of age. Class size will not exceed 15 students. This will provide opportunities for discussion between students and instructors. Although parents cannot attend, students are urged to discuss their reactions, thoughts, and "contract for change" with them.

### 2 Registration

Parent or guardian must register all participants under the age of 18 years.

### Requirements for Registration

The fee is \$45, as required by Nevada Law (AB174-NRS Chapter 62)

- \$45 cash, check, or money order
- Proper identification
- A parent or guardian if under the age of 18
