Howdy Y'all!



Indian Springs Appreciation Day at Creech Air Force Base

On Tuesday, March 12th, Creech Air Force Base welcomed Indian Springs residents, students from Indian Springs School, and other local groups to the 2014 Indian Springs Appreciation Day.

This annual event is an opportunity for the public to visit the base, meet Air Force personnel, view displays of military equipment and learn more about what goes on at the base that is such a close neighbor to Indian Springs.

While climbing inside an armored truck and getting to see a Predator Unmanned Aerial Vehicle is pretty exciting, the real highlight of the day is the air show performed by the Thunderbirds. The show included breathtaking maneuvers such as the Arrowhead Loop and the Delta Burst. Twice during the show the audience's attention was drawn one direction only to have a single jet race by unexpectedly from the other direction resulting in cheers and applause.



From this simple beginning, the Moapa Valley Fair became an annual event. In April 1988, the very first Clark County Fair was held at the current location at the Clark County Fairgrounds. Then, in 1997, the fair once again changed its name. Now known as the Clark County Fair & Rodeo, over 80,000 patrons come to the fair every spring.

With the rodeo, musical performances, exhibits, livestock show, great food and carnival midway, there is definitely plenty of fun for everyone!
