



VOTING ON ELECTION DAY AT HENDERSON VOTE CENTERS



(VOTING PROCESS DOES NOT APPLY TO POLLING PLACES IN OTHER CITIES)

April 5, 2011 Municipal Primary Election

Sample Ballots: Voters registered within the specific [boundaries](#) of Henderson will be mailed a sample ballot before early voting begins. These voters' sample ballots list the contests for which they are eligible to vote and all of the [Vote Centers in Henderson](#). The [early voting schedule](#) is also included.

CLARK COUNTY (UNINCORPORATED): **Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County do NOT participate in Municipal Elections.**

Any Henderson Voter May Vote at Any of that City's Vote Centers: Henderson is the only City with "Vote Centers." Unlike traditional polling places in other cities, Vote Centers are similar to early voting sites in that, on Election Day, Henderson voters may vote at any one of the [12 Vote Centers](#), regardless of where they live in the City. On Election Day in the other cities, voters may only vote at the specific polling place to which they are assigned within their city. The Election Day voting process at Vote Centers differs from traditional polling places in other cities.

Election Day Voting Process at Henderson Vote Centers (*also see "[Voting on Election Day](#)" for the process at traditional polling places in the other cities*):

- Upon arriving at the site, your eligibility and signature will be verified before you are allowed to vote. It is always a good idea to bring picture identification with you when you vote. The election clerk will announce your name, as required by Nevada law.
- After verifying your identity, the Clerk will give you a voting machine activation card.
- Computers at each site connect to the Election Department's centralized voter registration files. Your record is updated at the time of voting, thus preventing anyone from voting twice.
- You will proceed to a touch-screen voting machine to vote. You must insert the card into the machine to activate it for your specific precinct.
- When you are finished, immediately return the activation card to an election official.

Municipal Primary Election Voting: A Primary Election is a preliminary (nominating) election to select, when necessary, candidates who will run in the General Election contests. You may vote for all [offices](#) on the ballot for your precinct, regardless of your party affiliation. Municipal Elections are nonpartisan, meaning candidates' parties will not appear on the ballot. A candidate may be declared elected in the Municipal Primary Election if he or she receives a majority of the votes. Election rules and offices up for election vary by city. Voting Machines: All polling places are equipped with [electronic touch-screen voting machines](#). These machines include a voter verifiable paper printout of each ballot. The printout stays with the machine. The machines also provide [Spanish](#) and English ballots and instructions.

No Write-Ins: [Nevada Revised Statute 293.270](#) prohibits write-in candidates.

Tabulation: After the polls close at 7:00 p.m., the results are delivered to the [Election Center](#) (965 Trade Dr., Suite F, North Las Vegas) for processing. All Election Day ballots are tabulated along with early voting and mail/absentee ballots. The first tabulated results (early voting and mail/absentee ballots) will be reported after 7:00 p.m. and available on the Election Department's [Internet](#) site or [TV channel 4](#).
