April 5, 2011 Municipal Primary Election



Sample Ballots: Voters registered in an incorporated city will be mailed a sample ballot before early voting begins. Voters' sample ballots list their Election Day polling place (map and address), precinct, and contests for which they are eligible to vote. The [early voting schedule](#) is also included.

CLARK COUNTY (UNINCORPORATED AREAS): **Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County do NOT participate in Municipal Elections.**

Election Day Voting Process in All Cities EXCEPT Henderson (see "[Voting on Election Day at Henderson Voter Centers](#)" for an explanation of Henderson's procedures):

- Upon arriving at your assigned polling place, an election official will direct you to the correct precinct table.
- Give your name to a Clerk at the precinct table. The Clerk will find your name in the Precinct Register and ask you to sign next to your facsimile signature. The Clerk will then verify your identity by comparing your handwritten signature to your facsimile signature. Be aware that it is always a good idea to bring picture identification with you when you vote. The Clerk will announce your name, as required by Nevada law.
- After verifying your identity, the Clerk will give you a voting receipt, showing your precinct.
- You will then be directed to an election official who will issue you a voting machine activation card.
- You will proceed to an "Edge" (touch-screen) voting machine to vote. You must insert the card into the "Edge" to activate it for your specific precinct.
- When you are finished voting, immediately return the activation card to an election official.

Municipal Primary Election Voting: A Primary Election is a preliminary (nominating) election to select, when necessary, candidates who will run in the General Election contests. You may vote for all [offices](#) on the ballot for your precinct, regardless of your party affiliation. Municipal Elections are nonpartisan, meaning candidates' parties will not appear on the ballot. A candidate may be declared elected in the Municipal Primary Election if he or she receives a majority of the votes. Election rules and offices up for election vary by city. Voting Machines: All polling places are equipped with [electronic touch-screen voting machines](#). These machines include a voter verifiable paper printout of each ballot. The printout stays with the machine. The machines also provide [Spanish](#) and English ballots and instructions.

No Write-Ins: [Nevada Revised Statute 293.270](#) prohibits write-in candidates.

Tabulation: After the polls close at 7:00 p.m., the results are delivered to the [Election Center](#) (965 Trade Dr., Suite F, North Las Vegas) for processing. All Election Day ballots are tabulated along with early voting and mail/absentee ballots. The first tabulated results (early voting and mail/absentee ballots) will be reported after 7:00 p.m. and available on the Election Department's [Internet](#) site or [TV channel 4](#).
