Election Rules	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Nonpartisan Elections ● In the 2011 Primary Election, voters may vote for up to 2 City Council candidates (at large) and only 1 candidate for Mayor. ● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if the number of votes a candidate receives is greater than 50% of the total ballots cast (majority), he/she is declared elected and the seat or office will not appear in the General Election. 

	<p><i>Difference between Vote Centers and Polling Places: Henderson is the only City with "Vote Centers." Unlike traditional polling places in the other four Cities, Vote Centers are similar to early voting sites in that, on Election Day, Henderson voters may vote at any one of the 12 "Vote Centers," regardless of where they live in the City. On Election Day in the other four Cities, voters may only vote at the specific polling place to which they are assigned within their City.</i></p> <p><i>Unincorporated Clark County Voters: Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County, i.e., outside the specific boundaries of one of the five incorporated cities, may NOT vote in Municipal Elections.</i></p>

Incorporation and History	Received charter and incorporated on 10/1/59. Created by special act of Congress (Boulder City Act of 1958).	Incorporated on 6/8/53. Received Charter in 1965. Charter revised in 1971.	Incorporated on 3/16/11. Charter revised in 1973 to create Wards. First election by Ward was in 1975.	Incorporated on 5/24/84.	Incorporated on 5/1/46. In 1999, Charter revised to create Wards. 2001 was first election by Ward and voting was at large. In 2005, the Nev. Legislature directed City to put a question on Wards in 2006 General Election and it passed. 2007 was first election under new Ward system (voters elected council members for their own Ward, NOT at large).
