



# VOTING ON ELECTION DAY AT BOULDER CITY VOTE CENTERS

June 2, 2015 Municipal General Election



**Sample Ballots:** Voters registered within the specific [boundaries](#) of Boulder City will be mailed a sample ballot before early voting begins. These voter's sample ballots list the contests for which they are eligible to vote and all of the [Vote Centers in Boulder City](#). The [early voting schedule](#) is also included.

**Any Boulder City Voter May Vote at Any of that City's Vote Centers:** Unlike traditional polling places, Vote Centers are similar to early voting sites in that, on Election Day, Boulder City voters may vote at any one of the [3 Vote Centers](#), regardless of where they live in the City. At a traditional polling place, voters may only vote at the specific polling place to which they are assigned within their city. In addition, the Election Day voting process at Vote Centers differs from traditional polling place and will include an online "[Posting Log](#)" (a link will be on the [Election Department's home page](#)). The online "[Posting Log](#)" will show who voted and where, as well as continuous live time updating of turnout.

### **Election Day Voting Process at Boulder City Vote Centers:**

- Upon arriving at the site, your eligibility and signature will be verified on a computer before you are allowed to vote. It is always a good idea to bring picture identification with you when you vote. The election clerk will announce your name, as required by Nevada law.
- After verifying your identity, the Clerk will give you a voting machine activation card.
- Computers at each site connect to the Election Department's centralized voter registration files. Your record is updated at the time of voting, thus preventing anyone from voting twice.
- You will proceed to an electronic touch-screen voting machine to vote. You must insert the card into the machine to activate it for your specific precinct.
- When you are finished, immediately return the activation card to an election official.

**Municipal General Election Voting:** Candidates who receive the most votes in a General Election are elected to office. You may vote for all offices on the ballot for your precinct, regardless of your party affiliation. Municipal Elections are nonpartisan, meaning candidates' parties will not appear on the ballot. **Voting Machines:** All polling places are equipped with [electronic touch-screen voting machines](#). These machines include a voter verifiable paper printout of each ballot. The printout stays with the machine. The machines provide [Spanish](#), [Filipino \(Tagalog\)](#), and English ballots and instructions.

**No Write-Ins:** [Nevada Revised Statute 293.270](#) prohibits write-in candidates.

**Tabulation:** After the polls close at 7:00 p.m., the results cartridges are delivered to the [Election Center](#) (965 Trade Dr., Suite F, North Las Vegas) for processing. All Election Day ballots are tabulated along with early voting and mail/absentee ballots. The first tabulated results (early voting and mail/absentee ballots) will be reported after 7:00 p.m. and available on the Election Department's [Internet](#) site or [TV channel 4](#).
