**Who May Vote and Maps:** Only voters properly registered within the specific boundaries of Boulder City may vote in the 2015 Municipal General Election. Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County do NOT participate in Municipal Elections. The cities of Henderson, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas will not have a Municipal General Election in 2015 because candidates for all of their offices were elected in the Municipal Primary Election. Mesquite will have no elections at all in 2015 because it will consolidate its elections with the 2016 Federal/State Elections. | Election Rules | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Nonpartisan Elections</li> <li>● <b>GENERAL ELECTION, BUT NO PRIMARY ELECTION IN 2015.</b> A Primary Election is held only if more than double the number of candidates than offices/seats up for election, file to run for office. So, the contest for <b>Mayor did not appear on the ballot.</b> Only one candidate filed to run for that office, <b>ROD WOODBURY</b>, and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 4-year term. The contest for <b>two at-large City Council seats will only appear on the General Election ballot.</b> Three candidates filed to run for the two at-large City Council seats (<b>LINDA GRAHAM, "PEGGY" LEAVITT, and RICH SHUMAN</b>).</li> <li>● In the 2015 General Election, all Boulder City voters may vote for no more than 2 City Council candidates (at large).</li> <li>● If a candidate receives votes equal to the majority of voters casting ballots in the Primary, he/she is declared elected and the office/seat will not appear in the General Election (<i>not applicable in 2015</i>).</li> <li>● For each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes in the Primary, then twice the number of candidates to be elected (receiving the most votes) will be declared nominated and appear on the General Election ballot (<i>not applicable in 2015</i>).</li> <li>● In the General Election, the candidate(s) receiving the most votes is elected to office.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Nonpartisan Elections</li> <li>● <b>NO GENERAL ELECTION IN 2015.</b></li> <li>● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contest for <b>Municipal Court Judge, Dept. II, did not appear on the ballot.</b> Only one candidate filed to run for that office, <b>DOUGLAS H. HEDGER</b>, and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 6-year term.</li> <li>● In the 2015 Primary Election, all Henderson voters could vote for 1 candidate per contest in the contests for City Council Wards I, II, and IV (elected at large by Ward).</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. Accordingly, <b>GERRI SCHRODER, (Council Ward I), DEBRA MARCH (Council Ward II), and SAM BATEMAN (Council Ward IV)</b> were all elected to office in the Primary Election.</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates (receiving the most votes) per office proceed to the General Election ballot.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Nonpartisan Elections</li> <li>● <b>NO GENERAL ELECTION IN 2015.</b></li> <li>● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contests for <b>Municipal Court Judge, Depts. 4 and 6, did not appear on the ballot.</b> Only one candidate filed to run for those offices, i.e., <b>BERT BROWN (Dept. 4) and MARTIN HASTINGS (Dept. 6)</b>, and they were declared elected to a 6-year term.</li> <li>● In the 2015 Primary Election, Las Vegas voters could vote for 1 candidate per contest that appeared on their ballot in the contests for: Mayor; Municipal Court Judge, Dept. 1; and Councilman, Wards 1, 3, or 5. Voters could only vote for the City Council Ward in which they were registered to vote.</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. So, <b>CAROYLN G. GOODMAN (Mayor), CYNTHIA LEUNG (Muni. Ct. Judge Dept. 1), LOIS TARKANIAN (Council Ward 1), BOB COFFIN (Council Ward 3), and RICKI Y. BARLOW (Council Ward 5)</b>, were all elected to office in the Primary Election.</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates (receiving the most votes) per office proceed to the General Election ballot.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Nonpartisan Elections</li> <li>● <b>NO GENERAL ELECTION IN 2015.</b></li> <li>● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contest for <b>Municipal Court Judge, Dept. 2, did not appear on the ballot.</b> Only one candidate filed to run for that office, <b>SEAN HOEFFGEN</b> and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 6-year term.</li> <li>● In the 2015 Primary Election, North Las Vegas voters could vote for only 1 candidate per contest on their ballot in the contests for Council Member for Wards 2 and 4. Voters could only vote in the City Council contest for the Ward in which they are registered to vote.</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. Accordingly, <b>PAMELA A. GOYNES-BROWN (Council Ward 2) and RICHARD CHERCHIO (Council Ward 4)</b> were all elected to office in the Primary Election.</li> <li>● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates receiving the most votes per office proceed to the General Election ballot.</li> </ul> |
