Who May Vote and Maps: Only voters properly registered within the specific boundaries of the cities of Henderson, Las Vegas, or North Las Vegas (Wards 2 and 4 only) may vote in the 2015 Municipal Primary Elections and only in their own City's election at a site within their own City. **Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County do NOT participate in Municipal Elections. Additionally, Mesquite will have no elections at all in 2015 because it will consolidate its elections with the 2016 Federal/State Elections and Boulder City will not have a Primary Election in 2015 (see page 2 for details).** Log-in to our website to [look up](#) your voting eligibility, precinct, elected officials, etc. You may also [view](#) your sample ballot, Election Day polling place, or Henderson "Vote Center." 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Election Rules	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Nonpartisan Elections ● NO PRIMARY ELECTION IN 2015. A Primary Election is held only if more than double the number of candidates than offices/seats up for election file to run for office. So, the contest for Mayor will not appear on the ballot. Only one candidate filed to run for that office, ROD WOODBURY, and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 4-year term. The contest for two at-large City Council seats will not appear on the Primary Election ballot. Three candidates filed to run for the two at-large City Council seats (LINDA GRAHAM, "PEGGY" LEAVITT, and RICH SHUMAN) and the contest will only appear in the General Election. ● In the 2015 General Election, all Boulder City voters may vote for no more than 2 City Council candidates (at large). ● If a candidate receives votes equal to the majority of voters casting ballots in the Primary, he/she is declared elected and the office/seat will not appear in the General Election (<i>not applicable in 2015</i>). ● For each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes in the Primary, then twice the number of candidates to be elected (receiving the most votes) will be declared nominated and appear on the General Election ballot (<i>not applicable in 2015</i>). ● In the General Election, the candidate(s) receiving the most votes is elected to office. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Nonpartisan Elections ● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contest for Municipal Court Judge, Dept. II, will not appear on the ballot. Only one candidate filed to run for that office, DOUGLAS H. HEDGER, and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 6-year term. ● In the 2015 Primary Election, all Henderson voters may vote for 1 candidate per contest in the contests for City Council Wards I, II, and IV (elected at large by Ward). ● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. ● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates (receiving the most votes) per office proceed to the General Election ballot. ● In the General Election, the candidate(s) receiving the most votes is elected to office. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Nonpartisan Elections ● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contests for Municipal Court Judge, Depts. 4 and 6, will not appear on the ballot. Only one candidate filed to run for each one of those offices, i.e., BERT BROWN (Dept. 4) and MARTIN HASTINGS (Dept. 6). At the close of filing, they were declared elected to a 6-year term. ● In the 2015 Primary Election, Las Vegas voters may vote for only 1 candidate per contest in the contests for Mayor and Municipal Court Judge, Dept. 1. If a voter's ballot also contains a Councilman contest for Ward 1, Ward 3, or Ward 5, then the voter may additionally vote for 1 candidate in the applicable Ward. Voters may only vote for the City Council Ward in which they are registered to vote. ● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. ● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates (receiving the most votes) per office proceed to the General Election ballot. ● In the General Election, the candidate receiving the most votes is elected to office. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Nonpartisan Elections ● Candidates who remain unopposed at the close of candidate filing are declared elected. So, the contest for Municipal Court Judge, Dept. 2, will not appear on the ballot. Only one candidate filed to run for that office, SEAN HOEFFGEN and at the close of filing he was declared elected to a 6-year term. ● In the 2015 Primary Election, North Las Vegas voters may vote for only 1 candidate per contest on their ballot in the contests for Council Member for Wards 2 and 4. Voters may only vote in the City Council contest for the Ward in which they are registered to vote. ● In the Primary Election, if a candidate receives 50% plus one of the votes (majority), he/she is declared elected and the office will not appear in the General Election. ● In the Primary Election, for each seat or office, if no candidate receives a majority of votes, the top 2 candidates receiving the most votes per office proceed to the General Election ballot. ● In the General Election, the candidate receiving the most votes is elected to office.
