



VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

June 14, 2016 Primary Election



Sample Ballots: Voters registered in Clark County, NV, will be sent a sample ballot before early voting begins on May 28, 2016. Voters' sample ballots list their assigned Election Day polling place address, precinct, and contests for which they are eligible to vote. The [early voting schedule](#) is also included.



Voting Machines: All polling places are equipped with [electronic touch-screen voting machines](#). These machines include a voter verifiable paper printout of each ballot. The printout stays with the machine. The machines also provide [Spanish](#), [Filipino](#), and English ballots and instructions.

"Closed" Primary Election Voting Restrictions: In Nevada, Federal/State Primary Elections are "closed." That means if you chose Democrat or Republican as your party on your Voter Registration Application, you may vote only for candidates from your own party and you may also vote in nonpartisan contests. If you chose a party affiliation that was anything other than Democrat or Republican, you may vote only in nonpartisan contests.

No Write-Ins: [Nevada Revised Statute 293.270](#) prohibits write-in candidates.

Election Day Voting Process:

- Upon arriving at your assigned polling place, an election official will direct you to the correct precinct table.
- Give your name to a Clerk at the precinct table. The Clerk will find your name in the Precinct Register and ask you to sign next to your facsimile signature. The Clerk will then verify your identity by comparing your handwritten signature to your facsimile signature. The Clerk will announce your name and party, as required by [NRS 293.287](#).
 - *NOTE: It is always a good idea to bring picture identification with you when you vote.*
- After verifying your identity, the Clerk will give you a voting receipt, showing your precinct and party.
- The Clerk will ask you to initial the Precinct Register to confirm that you have received the correct voting receipt for your political party (as listed in the Precinct Register).
- You will then be directed to an election official who will issue you a voting machine activation card.
- Proceed to a voting machine and insert the activation card into it to activate it for your specific precinct and party. You may then [vote](#).

Results Tabulation and Turnout: After the polls close at 7:00 p.m., the results are delivered to the [Election Center](#) for processing. All Election Day ballots, **except provisional ballots**, are tabulated along with early voting and mail/absentee ballots. Turnout is also calculated. The first tabulated results (early voting and mail/absentee ballots) will be reported after the Secretary of State has indicated all statewide voting has ended, sometime after 7:00 p.m., and will be available on the Election Department's [Internet](#) site or [TV channel 4](#).
