

## North Las Vegas Justice Court - Department 2

### **JUDGE NATALIE L. TYRRELL**

#### **Court Dates: Monday - Thursday**

Judge Natalie L. Tyrrell has served as Justice of the Peace in North Las Vegas since January 2001. She was re-elected to serve a third term until January 2019, and has also served three terms as Chief Judge. She is the first woman judge in North Las Vegas.

Prior to her election she served almost 9 years as an elder law attorney with the City of Las Vegas Senior Citizens Law Project. She also served as an attorney arbitrator for the State of Nevada. She is licensed to practice law in both Nevada and Minnesota and before the United States Supreme Court.

Judge Tyrrell created an outreach program in 2002, KIDS IN THE COURT, partnering with C.P. Squires Elementary School, an at-risk school in North Las Vegas. This program educates fifth graders about the court system with emphasis on careers and the importance of staying in school. The students meet Judge Tyrrell, who visits the school to discuss her education and the judicial process. The students then take a field trip to the North Las Vegas Justice Court where they tour the facility, meet Judge Tyrrell's staff to learn about their jobs and education and then participate in a mock trial. Some of the students act as jurors, witnesses and defendants.

Judge Tyrrell was recently elected to the Board of Governors of the American Judges Association. She will represent District 5, which represents fifteen Western states and U.S. Territories.

Judge Tyrrell is a participant judge for Project REAL, whereby she hosts students in her court annually. She is currently serving on the State of Nevada Judicial Council and the Nevada Supreme Court Committee to Study Evidence Based Pretrial Release. Judge Tyrrell is the only charter member of the Board of the Friends of the North Las Vegas Library District. She is a member of the Nevada Judges of Limited Jurisdiction, National Association of Women Judges, the American Bar Association and the Clark County Bar Association. In 2006 she was inducted into the Nevada Law Foundation as a Colleague.

Judge Tyrrell has received numerous recognitions for her community involvement, including the Professional Services Award from the Latin Chamber of Commerce, the Amigo Award from the Mexican Patriotic Committee, and the Safe Kids Star Award. In her spare time, she volunteers as an amateur boxing judge.
