

# THE NEVADA COURT PROCESS

Understanding and using the court system can be overwhelming. There are laws, rules, forms, and terms (some of them in Latin!) to learn and adhere to. Therefore, to better understand a court's purpose, procedures and jurisdictions, consider the following:

## Is my issue Civil or Criminal?

- ✓ Lawsuit

## Which laws, codes, or statutes govern my issue?

- ✓ United States Code (**Federal**)

## What am I trying to do?

- ✓ Probate
- ✓ Relocate Child from State
- ✓ Title to Abandoned Vehicle

## Which court handles my issue?

- ✓ Supreme Court

## Where are the courts located?

- ✓ Regional Justice Center
- ✓ Family Courts and Services
- ✓ Rural Justice Courts
- ✓ Las Vegas Justice Court

**You will need to determine, based on your situation, which court is appropriate for your needs.** The Clark County Law Library has information and resources to help you research the court process for your issue.

### Procedural Resources:

- **Court Rules** provide rules of procedure for various Nevada courts. The Rules of Court govern issues including; but not limited to, court styling, how days are calculated and appellate procedure. - **Codes/Statutes** help you determine whether a law has been broken, which court to use, how you can proceed, and how much time you have to act. You may need to research Federal, State, County, or City laws, which are available on our Nevada Legal Research page at: [www.ClarkCountyNV.Gov/LawLibrary](http://www.ClarkCountyNV.Gov/LawLibrary)
- The **Nevada Civil Practice Manual** covers a variety of civil practice issues and may provide additional information about laws, forms, and procedures.

### Reference Resources:

- **Civil and Criminal Flow Charts** display the basic court progression for Civil and Criminal cases. The Civil Case Track and the Criminal Justice Flow Chart can be found in Pathfinder 21 and Pathfinder 22.
- **Legal Dictionaries/Encyclopedias** provide specific legal information and definitions of terms commonly used during the court process.

- **Self-Help Books** are written for non-attorneys who find themselves involved in legal matters. These books provide basic information that will allow you to make sense of more specific research. A list of Self-Help books by topic can be found in Pathfinder 28.
