


# SELF-HELP BOOKS

Legal Research can be overwhelming and the information, once found, can be difficult for a non-attorney to understand. Self-Help books can be an excellent source of information on a variety of topics. They can often provide you with a general understanding that will allow you to make sense of your more specific research.

Self-Help books can be useful for people who are not attorneys and choose to represent themselves in court without professional assistance. These people are often referred to as “Self-Represented”, “Pro Per”, or “Pro Se” litigants.
