

WESTLAW KEYCITE

KeyCite is a powerful citation research service available exclusively on Westlaw. You can use KeyCite to perform any of the following functions:

- View the history of a case, statute, administrative decision, or regulation to help determine whether it is good law and to retrieve citing references.
- View every case in West's National Reporter System®, as well as more than 1 million unpublished cases; selected federal and state administrative decisions; federal statutes and regulations; state statutes from all 50 states and regulations from selected states; U.S. patents;
- Search *American Law Reports* (ALR®), which includes hundreds of law reviews and thousands of briefs.
- Compile citing references from numerous texts and treatises.

The direct history of a case is added to KeyCite within one to four hours of receipt of the opinion at West, and citing cases are added as soon as they are added to Westlaw.

Checking a Document in KeyCite

Click **KeyCite** on the toolbar to determine whether a case, statute, administrative decision, or regulation is good law and to retrieve citing references.

1. Type a citation in the *KeyCite this citation* text box and click **GO**.
2. KeyCite history for the document is displayed in the right frame.
3. To display a graphical view of direct history, click **Direct History (Graphical View)**. Each court decision is shown at the appropriate trial or appellate level (U.S. Supreme Court, State High Court, Intermediate Court, or Trial Court).
4. To view a list of documents that cite your document, click **Citing References**.

5. Click **Limit KeyCite Display** at the bottom of the KeyCite citing references result to display the KeyCite Limits page from which you can restrict the list of citing references. Alternatively, click the arrow next to *Limit KeyCite Display* and choose a restriction from the menu that is displayed.
6. Print documents directly from the KeyCite history or citing references result: select the check box next to each document you want to print, then click a print icon in the upper-right corner.

KeyCite Status Flags



A red flag warns that the case or administrative decision is no longer good law for at least one of the points of law it contains or that the statute or regulation has been amended by a recent session law or rule, repealed, superseded, or held unconstitutional or preempted in whole or in part.



A yellow flag warns that the case or administrative decision has some negative history but has not been reversed or overruled; that the statute has been renumbered or transferred by a recent session law; that an uncodified session law or pending legislation affecting the statute is available (statutes merely referenced, i.e., mentioned, are not marked with a yellow flag); that the regulation has been reinstated, corrected, or confirmed; that the statute or regulation was limited on constitutional or preemption grounds or its validity was otherwise called into doubt; or that a prior version of the statute or regulation received negative judicial treatment.



A blue H indicates that the case or administrative decision has some history.



A green C indicates that the case or administrative decision has citing references but no direct history or negative citing references or that the statute or regulation has citing references.

★★★★ Examined—The citing case, administrative decision, or brief contains an extended discussion of the cited case or administrative decision, usually more than a printed page of text.



Discussed—The citing case, administrative decision, or brief contains a substantial discussion of the cited case or administrative decision, usually more than a paragraph but less than a printed page.



Cited—The citing case, administrative decision, or brief contains some discussion of the cited case or administrative decision, usually less than a paragraph.



Mentioned—The citing case, administrative decision, or brief contains a brief reference to the cited case or administrative decision, usually in a string citation.
