

The Nevada Judicial Code Commission Wants to Hear from You

The Nevada Supreme Court Commission established to evaluate the 2007 ABA Model Code of Judicial Conduct wants to hear from Nevada judges, lawyers, and interested members of the public. The Commission is undertaking the first comprehensive examination of the Nevada Code of Judicial Conduct since its adoption in 1991. Because the Code of Judicial Conduct impacts both lawyers and judges, it is important to let the Commission members know what you think before their final report is submitted to the Nevada Supreme Court in January.

Meeting dates, agendas, minutes, and drafts of proposed new Judicial Canons and Rules are posted there. Links to various related websites are also provided.

You are also welcome to attend the Commission meetings to share your thoughts in person. Meetings are scheduled for October 3, November 6 and 7, and December 4. Commission meetings are video-conferenced between the Nevada Supreme Court's Las Vegas and Carson City courtrooms. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. and adjourn at 4:30 p.m., except that the November 7 meeting will end at noon. If you wish to present public comment at a meeting, check the meeting agenda for the specific time set for public comment.
