




BioBlitz Event Guide

Before posting an observation, **sign in** or **sign up**.



Once signed in, add the Bioblitz project to your account by using the **Projects** dropdown menu arrow and typing in **'Clark County Wetlands Park Bioblitz 2015'**.



Add observation

To add an observation:

Notes:

What you saw.

Type in your identification. If you know the name of what you saw, type that here. If you aren't sure, use a broad term such as "bird" – if you click "lookup" you can select the best fit (e.g., "perching bird" or "hawk") – then click the "ID Please" button.

Where you were.

After searching for "Clark County Wetlands Park" using the text field, use the map to zoom and position the marker as precisely as possible.

Evidence in the form of photos or sound.

Only through evidence can observations be verified and incorporated into the 'research quality' list of species within the park.

A page confirming your observation entry will look like this.


