

**Albert L. Jones**

**November 8, 1887- October 5, 1970**

**Elected 1928, 4 year term**

**Albert L. Jones served one term on the Clark County Commission and campaigned on a promise of "straight-forward administration." Jones lived his entire life in the Moapa Valley and worked as a ranching and as a general store owner.**

**In 1928, Jones worked to win the votes of Las Vegas residents for his election to the Clark County Commission. He was an active Republican and a prominent citizen of Moapa Valley. Jones won his seat on the commission by defeating the Democratic candidate, J. Lewis Pulsipher.**

**Following his service on the County Commission, Jones returned to Moapa Valley and became the secretary-treasurer of the Muddy Valley Irrigation Company. He sought another term on the County Commission in 1932 against Harold Stocker. Jones lost the seat by a two to one margin.**

**Jones lived and worked in Overton. He owned and operated a general store. He died at his home on October 5, 1970 and was buried at the Overton Cemetery.**
