

Donald M. Clark

Reverend Donald M. Clark worked hard in West Las Vegas to develop the community and fight poverty and racism. He served the remainder of Woodrow Wilson's term on the Clark County Commission following Wilson's resignation.

Clark came to Las Vegas in 1952 after serving in the army. He worked for integration and in 1961 was elected president of the local NAACP. He also helped develop the Economic Opportunity Board in West Las Vegas. In 1967, Clark was named chairman of Operation Independence, a program that provided childcare, legal aid, and job placement in West Las Vegas.

He was appointed to the Clark County Commission in 1984. Clark continues to reside in West Las Vegas.
