

**Darwin Lamb**

**April 20, 1932—**

**Elected 1964 two years, 1966 four years**

**Darwin Lamb was born in 1932 in Alamo, Nevada to a prominent family. His brother Floyd served as a Lincoln County Commissioner and in the Nevada State Senate. His brother Ralph was sheriff of Clark County for eighteen years. Darwin Lamb served two terms on the Clark County Commission.**

**Lamb moved to Las Vegas when he was about ten years old. As an adult, he opened Lamco Alarms. He was an active member of the Young Democrats and served as president until he resigned once he received the party's nomination for County Commission. Lamb first ran for office in 1960, but lost in the primary for County Commission. In 1964, Lamb ran for a seat on the County Commission, easily defeating Bert Leavitt. In 1966, Lamb won a long-term seat on the County Commission on a platform of expanding county recreation services. He served on the Fair and Recreation Board and the Hospital Board. He was defeated for reelection by Tom Wiesner.**

**In the 1960s and 1970s, Lamb acted in small parts in movies and television shows that filmed around Las Vegas. He was an active member of the Nevada Cowboy Association. Lamb moved to Cedar City, Utah where he works as a political consultant, restaurateur, and owns Mr. Bubbles Carwash.**
