

**Donald "Chip" Maxfield**

**January 13, 1956**

**Elected 2000, 2004**

Donald "Chip" Maxfield has lived for most of his life in southern Nevada. He earned a degree in civil engineering from UNLV and opened his own firm, Southwest Engineering Firm.

Maxfield served on the Lone Mountain Citizens Advisory Council. In 2000, Maxfield ran against Lance Malone in the Republican primary for the Clark County Commission. He easily defeated Malone and went on to a slim victory against Lois Tarkanian in the general election. He campaigned on a platform of revising ethics rules and making it more difficult to change master plans for the county. In 2004, he replaced Mary Kincaid as chair of the County Commission. In 2004, voters re-elected Maxfield to the County Commission. On the Commission, Maxfield worked to protect Kyle Canyon and advocated for careful planning in growth.



In 2008, Maxfield announced that he would not seek re-election to the County Commission. He cited a desire to spend more time with his family and focus on civil engineering. He continues to work and live in Las Vegas.
