

John A. Egger

September 1, 1876—October 12, 1966

Elected 1918 short-term

John A. Egger settled in Goodsprings, Nevada around 1902. He developed a number of mining claims in the area and quickly became a fixture in the Goodsprings area.

He and his business partner, John Frederickson developed the Little Pal claim. They also took over the Bonnelli property near St. Thomas and operated a ferry service for hauling ore. In 1915, Egger married Frederickson's daughter, Claire, in Los Angeles.

Egger ran for the Clark County Commission in 1918. He ran for re-election in 1920 on a platform of support for good roads. James Cashman handily defeated Egger at the polls, winning 63% of the vote.

Egger died in 1966 at his home in Las Vegas.
