

Larry Brown

Larry Brown came to Las Vegas in 1983 as a professional baseball player to join the Las Vegas Stars team. After his retirement from baseball, he went to work for the Las Vegas Valley Water District as the director of public service. He was elected to the Las Vegas City Council and later the Clark County Commission.

Brown attended Harvard University where he achieved success in both baseball and football, graduating in 1979 with a bachelor's degree in Government. In 1999, Brown was inducted into the Harvard Varsity Club Hall of Fame.

After retiring from the Stars, Brown worked for the Las Vegas Valley Water District for several years. At the same time, he became involved in local politics.

In 1997, Brown won a seat on the Las Vegas City Council. He worked to add parks and manage growth in the city. As City Councilman for Ward 4, Brown served on the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, Clark County Regional Transportation Commission, Clark County Regional Flood Control Commission, Clean Water Coalition, Metro Fiscal Affairs Committee and Nevada League of Cities Board.

In 2008, Brown campaigned for the seat on the Clark County Commission vacated by retiring Chip Maxfield, citing his previous electoral experience and with promises to address county budget issues. Voters elected him to the board in 2008 for a four-year term. As a County Commissioner, Brown is Chairman of the Southern Nevada Regional Transportation Commission, the Regional Flood Control District, the Clean Water Coalition and, serves on the Metropolitan Police Committee on Fiscal Affairs.

Brown is an active member of many civic and charitable organizations. He is involved in youth sports and is a strong advocate for parks and open spaces.
