

Steve Sisolak

Elected 2008

Steve Sisolak served on the Nevada Board of Regents from 1998 until 2008, when he won a seat on the Clark County Commission.

Sisolak grew up in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In high school, he played basketball and other sports, and was active in the National Honor Society. He enrolled in the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and graduated with a degree in business in 1974 after less than three years in college. He moved to Las Vegas and enrolled in the UNLV School of Business. He graduated with a master's in Business Administration.



He opened two businesses that provided materials and printed promotional materials to companies and organizations. Sisolak became active in the Las Vegas community and served on various boards, including the American Heart Association, the Red Cross, the Boys and Girls Club, and the Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth. He became a business consultant in 2005, after selling his companies.

In 1998, Sisolak ran for the Board of Regents, the body that governs Nevada's higher education institutions. He won re-election in 2004.

Sisolak ran for the Clark County Commission in 2008 on his record of business sense and past service. Following his election to the Commission, he resigned his seat on the Board of Regents.
