

**Tom Collins**  
**June 22, 1950—**  
**Elected 2004, 2008**

**Tom Collins is a small business owner, community activist and former Nevada State Assemblyman who is serving his second term as the Clark County Commissioner for District B.**

**A resident of Clark County for most of his life, Commissioner Collins is a graduate of Western High School, where he met Kathy, his wife of more than 40 years. After high school, Commissioner Collins attended Midwestern and Texas Tech universities in Texas as well as Clark County Community College (now the College of Southern Nevada) and the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The commissioner is also a PSI graduate and completed the Nevada Power Company International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Apprenticeship Program.**



**Commissioner Collins worked for Nevada Power Company for more than 18 years, leaving as a Journeyman-Lineman in 1995 to start Collins Power Services, a power line installation company owned by the commissioner's wife.**

**He has been an active member of the local community through his involvement with the Boy Scouts (as Scoutmaster and Merit Badge Counselor), Little League baseball, Pop Warner football, and basketball and soccer programs. Prior to being elected in 1992 to the State Legislature, where he served five terms in the Assembly, Commissioner Collins was a member of the North Las Vegas Planning Commission for seven years, retiring as chairman.**

**Today, Commissioner Collins remains active with many organizations, his work on the commission and his family – the commissioner and his wife Kathy have two children and eight grandchildren.**

**The commissioner is a member of the National Senior Pro Rodeo Association, the Rodeo Cowboy Association, the Nevada Horse Council of Nevada and the Nevada Contractors Association. He remains a passionate advocate for agriculture and ranching interests, and personally raises cattle for rodeos and other equestrian activities.**

**In addition to his regular commission responsibilities, Commissioner Collins also represents the county on several boards and committees including the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, Southern Nevada Water Authority and the Colorado River Commission.**
