2014 Ducks Unlimited Las Vegas Continental Shoot

The Clark County Shooting Complex hosted the 2014 Ducks Unlimited Las Vegas Continental Shoot on February 20-23. It was the largest shooting event the shooting complex has seen to date since its opening in 2009. More than 420 registered shooters competed for

\$75,000 in prizes during the four-day event. Sponsored by Browning, Fiocchi, Budweiser, and Aliante Hotel & Casino, the event started on Thursday with "Fun Shoot" Side Games, 5-STAND and Preliminary

100 Sporting Targets through Friday. Then the Main 200 Target Event was held on Saturday and Sunday. Overall winners of the Preliminary Games and Main Event were awarded the coveted Maxus Shotgun and BPS Shotgun, respectively. Fiocchi contributed nearly 500 cases of ammunition that was distributed between the top winners of the Preliminary Games and Main Event, Side Games, 5-STAND Shoots, and raffles.

Aliante Hotel & Casino was the official host hotel for this year's Ducks Unlimited event providing special rates to event shooters. Event participants also enjoyed the "DU Dinner" at the Aliante on Saturday night. And a shuttle was made available to participants to and from the hotel and the shooting complex.

3-GUN NATION

Shooting Complex in January. The final match featured the top 30 qualified shooters from the series, who competed in man-on-man Shoot-Offs in a seeded bracket to determine the final winner. The 3-Gun Nation 2013-14 Champion received \$50,000 courtesy of Leupold Tactical Optics and NRA Sports.

The First Place Men's winner this year was Greg Jordan, who took the \$50,000 top prize. Second Place Men's winner was Taran Butler who took \$10,000. And the Third Place Men's winner of \$5,000 was Daniel Horner. The Women's First place winner, Lena Miculek-Afentul, won \$25,000.

The 3-Gun Nation Pro Series is the first of its kind, featuring the top shooters in the sport of 3-Gun. This six-event series crowns the 3-Gun Nation Champion. Each shooter competes in the same division, Tactical Optics, in a heads-up points race to qualify for the season-ending finale, which was held at the Clark County

In this interactive shooting event, competitors compete in three disciplines of the sport: Rifle, Shotgun, and Pistol. Shooters start back-to-back in the middle of the arena. Once the shot-timer goes off, the shooters sprint to the rifle area where they shoot six stationary steel targets. Upon hitting all 6 targets, they sprint to the shotgun course where they shoot at another six clay targets. After completing this section, the shooters sprint to the pistol section to shoot at six more stationary steel targets. The fastest time advances shooters in the competition.

Shoot Archery!

The most prestigious indoor archery competition in the world called the "Vegas Shoot" was held at the South Point Casino on February 7-9. More than 2,200 archers from around the world competed for \$185,000. This year's event set a new record of more than 500 youth archers in attendance from Nevada.

Each year, the top male and female archers qualify to go to the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) held in Kentucky in May. The top male this year was the Clark County Shooting Complex's (CCSC) very own Andrew Gardner. Andrew learned just a few years ago how to shoot at the CCSC and got involved with the Archery program at his school. Two years ago, he began shooting in the CCSC Wednesday Night Archery League. And today, Andrew works at the CCSC Archery Range as a Range Safety Officer. We wish Andrew good luck at the nationals this spring and welcome him to the CCSC archery staff!

The CCSC Wednesday Night Archery League launched on February 12. Sixty archers registered for the 10-week league that culminates with an awards

ceremony and potluck BBQ on April 30 at the CCSC Archery Range. The awards ceremony is fun for the entire family with activities and a raffle for various prizes donated by league sponsors.

The league offers archers of all skill sets an opportunity to compete in three classes of shooting. Genesis is the class that follows the NASP guidelines with one exception - archers are allowed to bring any bow so long as it shoots instinctive style, meaning without sights.

Bow Hunter Long Distance shooting is growing in popularity. Archers shoot at 20, 30, and 40 yards at a 40CM (centimeter) multi-colored target. It tests one's skill at shooting a combination of distances. Scoring can start at any distance depending on the lane assignment for the day.



Basic Firearm Safety

The Rifle-Pistol Basic Firearm Safety Course has been extended to teach users how to operate their firearm safely. A standard range fee applies. Participants must take the Basic Firearm Safety Course in the classroom (Part A) before participating in the shooting portion of the class (Part B).
