



Clark County Art Galleries Call for Artist Proposals: 2017-2018 Exhibition Season

Clark County Parks and Recreation will now review exhibit proposals from artists for the Winchester Cultural Center and Clark County Government Center Rotunda galleries' 2017-2018 exhibition year. The season begins in October, 2017 and runs through September, 2018. The deadline is Saturday, January 28, 2017.

To be considered, artists must reside in Clark County and submit a packet with the following four items:

1- Exhibition proposal - Describe the proposal and the concept behind it in a page or less. Do you intend to make new work or exhibit an existing body of work? What will the public experience with your exhibit? Informal renderings for site specific proposals are encouraged.

2- Artist statement

3- Artist resume (this should include all contact information, education, an exhibition history listing solo and group shows, awards/honors, and an optional bibliography and website address) *

4- Fifteen to twenty supporting digital images – no slides or prints. Digital images must be saved as .jpg files, and the file dimensions of the image's longest side should be between 1000 – 4000 pixels. All files should be named in the following format:

Last name_first initial_title_year_medium_dimensions.jpg

For example: Picasso_P_La Vie_1903_oil on canvas_75x50.jpg

Packets may be submitted by mail/hand delivery OR email. Mailed or hand delivered packets should be submitted to the attention of "Justin Favela: Exhibition Proposal" at

Winchester Cultural Center, 3130 S. McLeod Drive, Las Vegas, NV 89121 with digital images and supporting documents saved to CD or USB. If you wish to have your proposal packet returned to you, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Emailed proposals should be sent to justin.favela@clarkcountynv.gov with "2016-17 Proposal (your first and last name)" in the subject line. Image files attached in the email should adhere to the guidelines listed above and also be no larger than 1.5 MB each. Multiple emails per proposal are discouraged; however, if they are necessary, please limit to a maximum of 3. We are now accepting proposal materials through file-sharing services like Dropbox and WeTransfer, when using Dropbox please share the link and not the folder, which require subscriptions or sign-ups.

On dropbox.com

1. Sign in to dropbox.com, and find the file or folder you'd like to share.

*2. Hover over the file or folder, and click the Share button that appears. (If you're sharing a folder, you'll see a drop-down menu. **Choose Send link**).*

All three-dimensional work will be considered for both spaces while two-dimensional pieces can only be showcased at the Winchester Gallery. Clark County galleries cannot exhibit works containing offensive language or which contain overt sexual content or imagery (including nudity).

The Winchester Cultural Center houses Clark County Parks and Recreation's only theater and hosts concerts, recitals, fine arts, fitness classes and senior activities throughout the year. Two- and three-dimensional artworks, along with media-based and installation artworks, will be considered for this space. The center is open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays. The center is closed on Sundays and Mondays. Artists chosen for the Winchester Gallery will be paid an honorarium of \$500 to conduct a workshop to be coordinated with Winchester Cultural Center.

The Clark County Government Center Rotunda Gallery, 500 S. Grand Central Parkway near downtown Las Vegas, houses general administrative offices of Clark County government, chambers for the Board of Commissioners, a variety of special purpose spaces and an amphitheater in the courtyard. Only three-dimensional work will be considered for this space. Proposals that require electrical power or display walls will not be considered. Large-scale floor works are encouraged, but the selected project

may in no way interfere with the day-to-day operation of the building or compromise public safety. The proposed project or work must be able to withstand the wear and tear of being in a public space for seven to eight weeks. Artwork cannot be made from discarded materials. A visit by the artist to the space is encouraged before exhibit conception and submission. Artists chosen for the Rotunda Gallery will be paid an honorarium of \$750 for materials, and must give a public talk about their art.

Artists keep 100% of sales.

Submissions must be received or delivered by 6 p.m. Saturday, January 28, 2017. Accepted artists will be notified by March 18, 2017.
