Your libraries have always been a welcoming place for families, but with the designation of some of our branches as Family Place Libraries™, made possible by a grant from the national Institute of Museum and Library Services, we are expanding our resources for young children and their parents.

The importance of adult/child interaction cannot be overstated. Research has proven that only 25% of a newborn's brain is wired at birth while 90% is wired by age five. How adults respond and interact with children between birth and five years has a dramatic effect on social, emotional and intellectual development.

At the Clark County, Las Vegas, Whitney and Windmill Libraries, you'll find an expanded collection of picture books, board books, puzzles, blocks, toys, multimedia materials and more, all creating opportunities for little ones and their parents or caregivers to explore, learn, play, share books and meet other families. Librarians trained in early childhood development will be on hand as well to offer support.

In addition to activities and materials for children, our parenting collection covers every aspect of child rearing and parenting. Resources include books, DVDs, magazines and displays of current information for parents. Be sure to check out our online resources, including eBooks and eAudio materials.

Parents and caregivers are their children's first and most important teachers, and the Library is here to help! Stop by soon with your child and discover the wonder of learning at your library. March, April and May are busy and exciting months at the Library District. March 9 – 15 is the nationally-celebrated Teen Tech Week, where this year's theme, DIY @ Your Library, encourages teens to explore, create and share content beyond the classroom. We're also pleased to participate again in Each One, Read One, a "community reads" partnership with the Clark County School District and other local organizations. This year's title is *Marisol McDonald Doesn't Match* by Monica Brown, who will be visiting the West Las Vegas Library on Friday, March 7 at 10 a.m. In addition, special storytimes based on this book are planned at the Sahara West, Spring Valley, West Charleston and West Las Vegas Libraries.



CALL Helps Students Read, Learn and Achieve

CALL (Computer Assisted Literacy in Libraries) is a free program of the Las Vegas-Clark County Library District for adults who are over 17 years of age, read below the 8th grade level or who want to learn English as a Second Language (ESL). Instruction is provided at multiple locations by contracted teachers and supported through computer use and one-to-one tutoring. The program is committed to assisting students in acquiring the basic literacy skills needed to reach their identified goals and become informed, productive members of the community.

For the last reporting year, CALL reported an enrollment of 1,242 students who averaged 70 attendance hours. The program is proud of its high student retention rate of 81%, and of the fact that 64% of its students made gains of one or more educational levels (a 2% increase over last year).

Forty-nine students achieved naturalized American citizenship and 14 were awarded the National Work Readiness Credential. Work Readiness was a new class for CALL this past year. The class included math, reading, active listening and situational judgment – all skills necessary for success in an entry-level job. The real impact of CALL, however, can best be appreciated through the success stories of its students.

According to Literacy Services Coordinator Tim McDonald, “One of the students who faithfully rode three busses to get to [Work Readiness] class each day had the good fortune to be selected as a transportation ambassador for that same bus company. She had interacted with the bus company during the time that she was attending class, reporting concerns and compliments regarding their service. The job was a perfect fit for her. In a commendable act of ‘paying it forward,’ she donated her first day’s pay to the CALL program so that CALL can continue to help adults who have needs similar to hers.”

Allen Pai immigrated to the U.S. from Taiwan just a year ago. Not only did he receive his Work Readiness Credential, he found employment with the Nevada State Health Division’s, Bureau of Child, Family & Community Wellness. Argentina native Daiana Salas spoke no English when she moved to Las Vegas earlier this year. After seven weeks in the CALL program, Daiana is reading and writing English and working as a volunteer for the CALL program.

These success stories can be multiplied many times over and, thanks to a new federal incentive grant, the CALL program will expand its important work with support for the ESL Transitions Project. Through this project, advisors will work with students to create individual action plans, identify relevant post-secondary education and training opportunities, and assist teachers in customizing vocabulary instruction to meet the work and life goals of individual students. This project is designed to have a deep and far-reaching impact on the lives of the students served by the CALL Program.

Carlotta Dickerson is very familiar with libraries. She has held various positions throughout her 28 years with the Library District, starting as a page and working her way up to the branch manager of the Rainbow Library. The branch, a focal point for the northwest community, is located at the corner of North Buffalo Drive and Cheyenne Road. The Rainbow Library circulates more materials per square foot than any other in the Library District.

Did you always want to be a librarian?

It was important to me to have a career in which I could help people. I started in pre-medicine in college, but as I continued working for the Library District while going to school, I changed my degree. I was able to see the role libraries played in the community and the impact they had on people. I knew that librarianship was more than finding a book. It was a way to empower the community to change their lives with the many free tools and resources we make available.

What do you like best about your job?

It's helping people and knowing that we are providing valuable services to everyone in the community, regardless of age or economic situation. It's the smile and the gratitude we see on the customer's face when we made their day that much better.

Is there one service or product people would be most surprised to find at the library?

We get a number of customers who are surprised by the amount of downloadable music, magazines or books we offer. I'm impressed with the Rocket Languages database. You can learn a language on your own terms and in your own time. It's interactive with audio lessons, language and cultural lessons, and you get to test your progress immediately. Languages offered are Spanish, Arabic, French, German, Chinese (Mandarin), Hindi, Inglés (ESL), Italian, Japanese, Korean and American Sign Language. Learn anytime or anywhere.

Has the library customer changed over the last five years?

Society in general has become more tech savvy and this is reflected in our library users. We now have users who download their books and music, patrons who come in to use free Wi-Fi or use a computer to apply for a job. We also are seeing a library as a place to meet up and work on projects or have a quiet conversation.

What happens at your Cover 2 Cover Book Club?

If you love to read and talk about books, you'll enjoy our book club that meets every third Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Each month members are notified of the new title and reminders are posted on our Facebook page at www.facebook.com/RainbowLibrary. We read major blockbusters, classics, literary novels and fiction. Just sign up at the Reference desk.

How do you support your young readers?

Our community consists mainly of middle class families with 28% of our population under the age of 18. Our Young People's Library is a thriving center of the branch's activities and we offer on average 40 programs for children per month. We also offer a special Homework Power Hour on Monday through Thursday from 6:45 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. when the computers in the young adult area are reserved and dedicated for homework only, so that students can complete their assignments and complete their last minute print jobs.

What advice would you give to someone not having a library card?

Don't miss out on some of the wonderful materials and services your free library card gives you access to!



FREE Music & Magazine Downloads from the Library's Website



Monthly Book Clubs

Have you started saving time, money (and trees) by downloading music and magazines from the Library's website? It's absolutely free and the music and magazines you download are yours to keep forever!

Freegal Music is the name of the free music download service—it's a little bit like iTunes from the Library! Choose from over seven million songs from thousands of labels including the Sony Music catalog. Download music videos too.

Songs are MP3 and videos are MP4 with no Digital Rights Management. Enjoy three hours of streaming music per day or download up to six songs per week, and listen to a sample before you download. You can transfer them to multiple devices as well as burn them to CD.

Search by album, artist, keyword, song and genre for the tunes you want. Freegal works on both Macs and PCs and you can import downloads into iTunes. There is also a mobile app for iOS and Android devices.

You'll find music among scores of genres from acapella and acid jazz to world music and zydeco; from Christina Aguilera to Weird Al. Check out Freegal Music and start downloading your free tunes today!

With **Zinio**, you can read your favorite magazines on multiple viewing platforms such as computers, smartphones, tablets, and other Internet-enabled devices. There are no holds or checkout periods.

Zinio's unique technology digitally recreates a magazine page for page, including full color pictures, intuitive navigation, keyword article search and interactive elements such as audio and video. *Good Housekeeping*, *National Geographic*, *Us*, *House Beautiful* and *Readers Digest* are just a few of the popular titles available.

To use Freegal and Zinio, you'll need an active library card and PIN, and your account must be free of fines and fees. Get started by clicking on the **Freegal Music Download** and **Zinio eMagazine** links in the Quick Links box on the Library's homepage at www.lvccl.org. Instructions are available on how to create an account and get started.
