

Read, Learn and Achieve at Your Library This Spring

Spring is a busy time at your libraries, and I invite you to take advantage of the many special programs and activities planned during March, April and May.

Once again the Library is participating with the Clark County School District and several other organizations in the community-wide reading program called *Each One Read One*. This program is designed to foster community connection while promoting literacy by encouraging Valley residents to read the same book and discuss it at home or in a variety of settings. This year's featured book is by Kathleen Krull, an award-winning children's author who has written over 60 books, most notably biographies. This year we'll read *The Boy on Fairfield Street: How Ted Geisel Grew Up to Become Dr. Seuss*.

Speaking of reading, it's not too soon to think about the Library's free Club Read, starting in June. There will be programs and reading logs for toddlers, school age children and teens. While it's true that reading over the summer can prevent "summer slide" and ensure a child goes back to school in the fall ready to learn, it's important to remember that Club Read is for every child, regardless of reading level.

It's wonderful to see a child experience the pride that comes from starting a goal and finishing it, and enjoy the sense of belonging that comes from joining the reading "club" with their schoolmates and neighbors. And with special storytimes, puppet and magic shows, crafts and other activities, Club Read is lots of fun, too. Look for promotional information as we get closer to summer, and join Club Read this summer!

April is National Volunteer Month, a time to celebrate the work that volunteers do all year round and to encourage new volunteers to make a difference in their communities. Volunteer activities include assisting in the used bookstores, tutoring and providing other assistance for the Library's literacy program, shelving books and helping with special events. Volunteering is a great way to help the Library do more with less, to make new friends and to experience the satisfaction that comes from giving back to the community. Sunrise Library

More Value. More Variety.

For the past four years, Anna Vaillancourt has been the branch manager of the Sunrise Library. Located in the northeast valley, the branch is situated in a multigenerational neighborhood. Anna has held positions with increasing responsibilities throughout her 15-year career with the District, and believes every library is unique and every branch offers an adventure for the curious.

How did your passion for libraries come about?

One of my earliest and fondest memories is of my aunt taking me to the public library at a very young age. She instilled in me my love of books and pursuit of lifelong learning.

What is the importance of storytime programs?

Storytime plays an important role in introducing children to the magic of books, developing language and other early literary skills. Many storytimes are theme based to celebrate the seasons, highlight a special author, or share traditions from other cultures and countries. We have special weekly storytimes for babies through age 11, including one for the whole family. Everyone enjoys a good story!

What resources do you have for the student?

Beyond books, music and DVDs, the library has a new Homework Help Center where on-site tutors assist students with their homework Monday through Thursday from 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Students can use the 10 laptops to search library databases and Internet resources to help with a research project, write a report or complete an assignment.

Students can also access the Library's special Homework Help web page from home or school with Internet access. They select Homework Help under Quick Links on the Kids or Teens pages to find information on a variety of subjects. For online tutoring, HelpNow from Brainfuse connects the student with a live tutor for help in English Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies and Writing.



Do you have free wireless Internet access?

Yes, we do! You can use your own laptop, iPad or smartphone to connect to the Internet. For those who do not have a laptop, our public computers are equipped with Internet access, word processing, spreadsheet and desktop publishing software. Customers can use the computers to fill out an online job application, obtain a food handler safety training card, or review the study guides and sample tests for employment exams. The library subscribes to the Learning Express Library, which provides test preparation materials and interactive practice exams that will help people improve their scores on academic, civil service, military, and professional licensing and certification exams.

What are people most surprised to learn that you offer at the library?

The free classes for the non-native English speaker who wish to improve their skills in reading and understanding English. These classes are offered Monday through Thursday beginning March 25 through May 9 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Just call 507-3530 to register.

What advice would you give to someone visiting your branch for the first time?






BusinessDecision is a new web-based service that combines extensive consumer household, business and demographic data with state-of-the-art mapping technology known as geographic information systems (GIS). It's the same kind of information used by the nation's top companies to help with such tasks as finding prospective customers, analyzing trade areas, evaluating competitors, identifying new store locations, and targeting media buys and direct mail campaigns. Use BusinessDecision and reduce costs, improve services to existing customers and attract new ones!


Hot Topics

Free Wi-Fi is available at all Library District branches except at the Meadows Library and the Mt. Charleston Library.



New! Mobile Printing at Your Library

Your library branches offer several ways to conveniently print homework, business documents and other important items.

The newest printing service is "cloud" printing. You can print from any smartphone, tablet, laptop or PC from anywhere with a Wi-Fi or 3G/4G Internet connection and an email address. Pay for your printing via PayPal or use a debit or credit card. Receive a confirmation code by email and visit the library branch you selected to release your print job.

To print using the library's Wi-Fi service, you must first connect to the library's free public Wi-Fi network from a device running Windows XP or higher in a Windows environment. To pay for printing, you can use funds in your account, or pay a staff person.

You may also print from the public computers in the branches or in the computer labs.

To reserve a library computer, choose Reserve a Computer from the library's website at www.lvccld.org or call your nearest branch.

To print using the Wi-Fi or mobile printing options, visit www.lvccld.org/cardsservices and select Wi-Fi/Mobile Printing.
