



READ for the Fun of It!

Look no further than your local library for a summertime activity that's free and fun for the kids. When summer vacation rolls around, put reading at the top of the list.

Club Read is a free program that offers teens, toddlers, school-aged children and their families the opportunity to have fun while keeping track of their reading. It's an activity for children who read at all levels, even pre-readers who are still being read to. It will keep your kids entertained and give them a sense of accomplishment that comes from completing a goal.

Kids can join friends and neighbors in a common activity and read books of their own choosing instead of what they must read for school. Your library has shelves of mind-expanding fun, from fantasy and adventure to books on science and sports. Magazines, comic books and graphic novels also provide great reading opportunities. Summer Reads on page 3 offer a few suggestions to help your child fill up the Club Read log.

Club Read bookmark reading logs may be picked up at the library starting June 1 and each age group has their own. Find more details about Club Read on page 6 or check with your favorite branch or visit www.lvccld.org.

In addition to reading fun, special programs are planned for kids of all ages. Norman Foote, who has received international acclaim for his song writing, outrageous props and offbeat sense of humor will perform in concert. The Hampstead Stage Company will perform *The Wizard of Oz* and the fabulous Fratello Marionettes will perform Mother Goose Land. You'll find more great programs in this issue to help you and your child enjoy Club Read.

Reading just 20 minutes a day can give your child a huge advantage in school and in life. When parents and children enjoy summer reading together, children move forward even faster, developing a love of books and reading skills that last a lifetime.

All the studies are clear that the most effective way to help a child become a reader is to show them through your own example that you value literacy and that reading is fun. The library's collection of downloadable materials makes it easy to read or listen to a good book this summer without leaving your lawn chair. 


And the Award Goes To...

Why should the kids have all the fun this summer? Summertime provides a great opportunity for some reading of your own. The library's extensive catalog includes titles that have won some very impressive awards. Here are a few books and authors that won in 2015 and you can find them at your library.


The **Nobel Prize for Literature** has been awarded to writers for their achievements in literature since 1901. The winner for 2015 was Svetlana Alexievich, "for her polyphonic writings, a monument to suffering and courage in our time." Her works, *Voices from Chernobyl*, presents personal accounts of what happened to the people of Chernobyl after the nuclear reactor accident in 1986. In English translation for the first time, *Secondhand Time: The Last of the Soviets*, is an oral history of Russia from the collapse of the Soviet Union to the rise of Putin.




The **Pulitzer Prize for Fiction** is awarded for distinguished fiction by an American author, preferably dealing with American life. In 2015, the prize was awarded to Anthony Doerr's *All the Light We Cannot See*, an instant New York Times best-seller about a blind French girl and a German boy whose paths collide in occupied France as both try to survive the devastation of World War II.




The **Pulitzer Prize for Nonfiction** is awarded for a distinguished and appropriately documented book of nonfiction by an American author. Elizabeth Kolbert's *The Sixth Extinction: An Unnatural History*, a book that draws on the work of geologists, botanists, marine biologists and other researchers to discuss the five devastating mass extinctions on Earth and predicts the coming of a sixth, received the prize in 2015.



Marlon James won the **Man Booker Prize** in 2015, the United Kingdom's top literary prize, with *A Brief History of Seven Killings*. A novel framed as a fictional oral history that explores the events and characters surrounding the attempted assassination of singer Bob Marley during the political turmoil on Jamaica in the late 1970s. James is the author of two other novels including *The Book of Night Women* and *John Crow's Devil*. The latter, his first novel, was shortlisted for the Commonwealth Writers' Prize, was a finalist for the Los Angeles Times Book Prize and was a New York Times Editor's Choice.



The **Edgar® Award**, named after Edgar Allen Poe, is presented by the Mystery Writers of America, dedicated to promoting a higher regard for crime writing. Stephen King's *Mr. Mercedes* won for Best Novel in 2015. A detective thriller about a hit-and-run driver who drives a stolen Mercedes into a crowd at a job fair, killing eight and maiming 15. King has written over 50 horror, science fiction, fantasy and suspense novels. His most recent, *Finders Keepers*, is a sequel to *Mr. Mercedes*, and *End of Watch*, the conclusion to the best-selling trilogy, has a release date of June 2016.



Mr. Panda has a plate of doughnuts to share, but most of the other animals forget to say "Please."






Penguin on Vacation by Salina Yoon


School-aged Readers

The Fourteenth Goldfish by Jennifer L. Holm


