- 2) be a resident of the unincorporated town encompassed by the board

Town Advisory Boards in Clark County

Pursuant to NRS 269.515, a town advisory board (TAB) means a board that is created by certain provisions in state law that assists the Board of County Commissioners in the government of an unincorporated town.

The duties of the TABs are to assist the BCC through an advisory capacity about their respective towns. From time-to-time, the BCC can assign specific duties to TABs. TABs hold regular, public meetings throughout the year. At those meetings, members of the boards as well as other citizens receive information related to matters pertaining to their town, provide input regarding various matters, forward concerns or problems to the BCC, and on occasion, assist in long-term planning.



Pathway from Poverty

Pathway from Poverty was built to improve the quality of life for residents in the northeast Las Vegas Valley. Through a variety of partnerships with Metro, area schools and community centers, apartment complex management and local businesses, we work to share and provide resources such as the After Market grocery and food pantry.

Young men from the area have joined the Metro DREAM program (Discover, Redirect, Empower, Advocate, and Mentorship), which provides mentorship to at-risk youth, empowering them to make positive life choices and build successful futures.

The Southeast Area Command is a steady partner in establishing programs to reduce the number of shootings and we continue to work with the Zoning department to address unhoused people encampments.

I'm very proud of this program and all the good it has brought to the South East Valley and I look forward to bringing you more updates. If you would like to be a partner in Pathways from Poverty, contact my office.

Flu Season is Here

Flu is a contagious disease that spreads around the United States every year, usually between October and May. Anyone can get the flu, but it is more dangerous for some people. Infants and young children, people 65 years of age and older, pregnant people, and people with certain health conditions or a weakened immune system are at greatest risk of flu complications.

In an average year, thousands of people in the United States die from flu, and many more are hospitalized. Flu vaccine prevents millions of illnesses and flu-related visits to the doctor each year.

The Health District offers flu vaccine at all Health District clinic locations each fall. Check individual public health center locations for hours of operation. No-cost flu clinics are also offered at various locations in the community throughout flu season.




Don't miss out on Water Smart Landscape rebates!
