V. Informational Items

1. Receive a report from Las Vegas Valley Water District regarding the current well levels, status of the Blue Diamond Water System and other related concerns (for discussion only)

**Jordan Bunker reported that the May readings show the North well at a static water level of 21.66 ft below land surface and the South well at 21.4 ft below land surface. The service line replacement project will begin in August, 2022. Tyler Byrd of Byrd Underground Construction has been contracted by LVVWD to complete the repairs. The LVVWD is planning on holding an open meeting along with Byrd Construction to answer questions and give further details of the repair process prior to work beginning.**

2. Receive a report from Metro regarding activity and statistics during the past month and other area crime concerns (for discussion only)

**Sgt. Pickler reported that another horse has been shot at the Cowboy Trail Ranch on Hwy 159. Full resources of the LVMPD are in force to apprehend the criminal.**

3. Receive a report from BLM regarding current and upcoming projects, updates on Red Rock Legacy bike trail, information about Red Rock National Conservation Area, and other updates about Public Lands in the area (for discussion).

**Josh Travers has returned and reported that the final decision on Calico Basin Management Plan has been signed and implementation is to begin. Public comments on Legacy Trail Phase 1 are being reviewed and changes being made. Phase 2 is in the design and planning stage. Phase 3 has a current budget of \$35 million to design, plan and construct a portion. It will take approximately 9 months to begin. Phase 4 which will connect all the phases of Legacy Trail with a \$35 million budget which will include more parking, restrooms and trails. The BLM continues to do much restoration due to off road vehicles abuse and misuse. There will be Public Meetings upcoming to discuss the new Red Rock Business Plan which will address the need for increasing entrance fees to the Red Rock Recreation area, administrative costs, and reservation system. It is estimated that 4 million visitors will be expected a year. On July 12, 2022 there will be a drilling rig which will be sampling soil in the overlay.**

4. Receive a report from Clark County Administrative Services regarding updates on recent land use applications and any other updates from Clark County (for discussion only)

**Meggan Holzer reported that there is no definitive timeline for repairs from Southwest Gas at this time. Control Technologies will be having a virtual meeting on July 13 to discuss current discussions on the water pumping station. The Dark Skies program that was passed during the last legislature is still in process. The illegal sign on Blue Diamond Road has been removed. Correction, the Hardy Wells water usage reading reported at the last meeting were actually the Arden Pipeline numbers. There is no update at this time regarding the landfill. It is encouraged that if any resident sees an issue in need of repair to use the FIXIT Clark County App to report the situation.**


VIII. Comments by the General Public
