1 October Memorial Committee Meeting June 23 Public Invited to Join Email List to Get Updates, Offer Feedback

Clark County's 1 October Memorial Committee will meet at **9 a.m.** on **Wednesday, June 23**, in the Clark County Commission Chambers at the Clark County Government Center located at 500 Grand Central Pkwy. near the corner of Charleston Blvd. and I-15. A virtual format will also be available for those unable to attend the meeting in the Commission Chambers.

Committee members will receive a presentation by Bridget Kelly of the Cannon Survey Center and discuss focus group responses and possible second survey questions. Staff also will provide a monthly update on various activities including survey topics, marketing, and research. The meeting agenda is posted online at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/1OctoberMemorial. Committee members and County staff will also host the meeting on WebEx, which is accessible by computer and telephone. Anyone wishing to provide public comment at the beginning or end of the meeting remotely can join the meeting by connecting to WebEx by dialing **1-408-418-9388** and entering the access code **187 398 7744**. Those wishing to offer comment will be muted until they are invited to join the meeting during public comment periods.

Committee meetings are held at 9 a.m. on the fourth Wednesday of each month in Commission Chambers at the Government Center, 500 Grand Central Parkway, located in downtown Las Vegas. The County Commission appointed the seven-member 1 October Memorial Committee to gather input from the public and develop recommendations for a permanent memorial in the Las Vegas Valley. The goal is to create a lasting memorial that remembers the victims, honors the survivors and first responders, and celebrates the resiliency of our community. Anyone impacted by the 1 October attack is encouraged to participate in the memorial development process whether you live in the Las Vegas Valley or outside our community.
