#### Parks and Recreation

Item 1- is in predesign

Item 2 - the bleachers have been brought to ADA standard. Town board members have mixed feelings about the cost of covering the arena.

Item 3 - Lois is curious if Green Valley Grocery can assist with this cost since they are rebuilding across the street and upgrading their facilities.

Notes: Sewer line is being ran from the high school to the edge of Heyer and Frehner. Joe mentioned that there are elevation issues so that is something to consider. Brian - has concern about funding septic since there are current efforts to connect to sewer.

<u>Description for Clarification</u>: this item is to request a commercial septic dumping station to serve RV's/visitors.

Item 5 - a splash pad is included in the ball field upgrade

#### Other

Item 2 - a go cart racing track is coming soon as Jeff Hobbs has acquired land

Brian asked about the bleacher repairs and damage to the covered stalls. John Stastny - a total of 30 pods are going to be replaced and the project will take approx. 125 days to completion. The same contractors will reinstall the bleachers which will include the addition of a power box on the west end of the bleachers. The pad for the plaza stage is going to be redone with an addition of ground anchors. Concrete will also be installed on the south walkway leading into the midway.

#### VIII. Public Comment

Lois discussed the flooding issues and the large need for flood control for the community. Narita Espinosa - on behalf of Cappalappa, discussed the drainage issues at Bonneli Ave and Moapa Valley Blvd. They had to dispose of two dumpsters full of items due to water damage which includes office furniture. They are asking for the community's assistance. Brian -mentioned that the detention basin will be installed in the next couple of years and the approval to rebuild some of the dams that were previously ordered removed by the state. Wil - this issue has remained a priority for Marilyn. She is working with multiple entities on an organized effort. These projects are handled by the Regional Flood Control District. Lois thanked their local first responders for serving the community.



# Moapa Valley Budget Requests: Please refer to the 9.14.22 Minutes

#### Parks and Recreation

- 1. Finish ball fields & add play area for children. Add shade for bleachers with misters. Currently in predesign
- 2. Clark County Fairgrounds Upgrades:
  - o Fix and cover Rodeo Arena bleachers & add walkway.

### Bleachers have been brought to ADA Standard

**Description:** Bleachers need to be brought to ADA standards including handicapped accessible seating. Lack of visibility is an issue because the bleachers are same height. The board would like the walkway to be lowered so avoid visibility issues when event goers are going to concessions and using the restroom.

- o Extend the JR Livestock's existing awning heading into the area by approximately 6'.
- O Cover Existing Practice Arena with possible lighting Description: The board discussed looking at two possibilities- a brand new covered arena or covering the existing arena and requested a cost comparison from Horseman's Park. During the 7.10.19 MVTAB meeting Janice provided the cost for Horseman's Park COVER ONLY in the amount of \$4,777,000. The town board members discussed the possibility of a self-imposed tax which could be added to the ballot during an election cycle.
- 3. Commercial septic for Fairgrounds

**Description:** Clark County staff will work to identify a location; there are two possible sites: the east side of the Fairgrounds or at a site located off the main boulevard.

Additional Comments for Clarification: this item is to request a commercial septic dumping station to serve RV's/visitors.

- 4. 4-H building enlarged (livestock building at the Fairgrounds)
- 5. Add splash pad to Logandale Park
- 6. New chairs with new storage racks for community center.
- 7. Add a separately designated pickle ball court to the Logandale Park.

#### Other

1. Shooting area with lights and maintained road (N. 200 acres of Heyer on the East side of Heyer)

**Description:** Board needs the County and BLM to designate the area of the shooting park so residents can legally shoot there. Shooting at night would be more convenient because of the desert heat.

NOTES: Brian Burris is interested into looking at possible funding from the NRA and Clark County

2. Construct a BMX track by Fire Station #73

**Description:** Would need a group, similar to the way little league runs the baseball games, to run the track. It would be a club ran by volunteers who would maintain the track.
