Four Clark County commissioners were sworn into office Monday, Jan. 4 in the Government Center amphitheater. The Commissioners who won election this fall and were sworn in are William McCurdy II (District D), Ross Miller (District C), Marilyn Kirkpatrick (District B), and Michael Naft (District A).





COMMISSIONER NAFT SEEKS PUBLIC INPUT ON CLARK COUNTY'S NEWEST COMMUNITY CENTER

COUNTY EXTENDS FUNDING FOR SCHOOL DAZE CAMP

Clark County will continue to offer the School Daze program at no charge until March 30, 2021 for those who qualify for the CCSD free and reduced lunch program. As a result of COVID-19 and the continued closure of public school facilities, School Daze is a program where school age children ages five to fourteen years of age can participate in distance learning in a supervised and socially distanced environment.

Any student who qualifies for free or reduced lunch through the Clark County School District can register into the program at no charge. To qualify, parents or guardians must come in person to the School Daze location they will be attending with the following:

- 1) A letter from the Clark County School District confirming that their child(ren) qualifies for free or reduced-price lunch.
- 2) Completed Parks and Recreation School Daze Registration Form. After initial registration with qualifying paperwork is complete, future registration can be done online at www.clarkcountynv.gov/parks.
